

ANNUAL REPORT 2022-23



At St Joseph's University, in keeping with the nearly 150 year old legacy of Jesuit pedagogy, we have been keeping our focus on challenging students to integrate the intellectual, spiritual and social dimensions of their lives. Thanks to Almighty God, in this academic year too, we were able to re-dedicate ourselves to the foundational touchstone of our institution – holistic, transformative, enabling education – based on our motto, "Faith and Toil." And truly, we have been rewarded for following our goals consistently, as this year St Joseph's College became St Joseph's University.

Given below is the Annual Report for 2022-23.

Inauguration of SJU

The unprecedented highlight of the year gone by was undoubtedly our transition from St Joseph's College to St

Joseph's University. In February 2021, St Joseph's University bill was presented in the Karnataka Legislative Assembly and was subsequently passed by the Legislative Assembly and Karnataka Legislative Council. The college received its University status on July 2, 2022, and was inaugurated as India's first Public-Private-Partnership University by the Honourable President of India, Ms Droupadi Murmu on September 27, 2022. The Hon'ble President unveiled the plaque to mark the historic milestone of the inauguration. Most Rev Dr Peter Machado, the Archbishop of Bengaluru, offered his prayers and invoked the blessings of Christ over SJU. The occasion was also graced by the presence of Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka, Mr Thaawarchand Gehlot, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Karnataka, Mr Basavaraj Bommai, Hon'ble Minister

for Higher Education, Dr C N Ashwathnarayan, and other eminent guests. The institution was hailed by the dignitaries not just for being a part of the growth of Bengaluru but also that of the whole of Karnataka and for giving excellent students to society who have excelled in all fields.

Alumni & Hostel Celebrations

This year saw the glorious Centenary Celebrations of the SJU Alumni Association on February 5, 2023. During the event, a special postal cover was released commemorating the centennial celebration of the St Joseph's Alumni/ae Association, the oldest alumni association in the state. This year also saw the 75th Platinum Jubilee celebrations of the Hostel Block and illustrious alumni/ae were in attendance on January 26, 2023 to mark the occasion.



College Day & Graduation Day

The last academic session came to a close with the 139th College Day being celebrated on July 13, 2022, and the Graduation Day being conducted on July 14, 2022 at the University Ground.

Institution Day

It is customary for the members of the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) to come together for Institution Day and interact with one another, strengthen our bonds of collaboration and honour the veterans who have rendered their valuable service to our institutions. This year the Institution Day was held on February 25, 2023 at St. Joseph's College of Law, Bangalore. Dr Thimappa Hegde was the special invitee and delivered the Keynote Address.

BJES Sports Day

SJU played host to this year's Bangalore Jesuit Educational

Society (BJES) 'Staff Sports Meet - Arrupe Cup 2023' on February 4, 2023 in the University Grounds. The Chief Guest was Indian Olympian and Josephite Mr Hakimuddin Shabbir Habibulla. The theme this time was 'Alentar Magis' (the spirit to do more). The event was very well-organised and highly appreciated by members of the BJES family.

Admissions, New Courses, Student Orientation

The 2022-2023 academic year began with the first Student Orientation programme held on August 23 and 24, 2022. A total of 3071 students were admitted for UG courses and 848 for PG courses in the college. This year, the college has over 7000 students and 458 staff. Around 43 faculty members joined our Josephite family and we warmly welcome them. The University proudly offers 42 UG courses, 22 PG courses, 22 PhD

programmes, and 6 Diploma Courses. This year, 51 different certificate courses were offered, which included diversified areas such as cinema, music, dance, martial arts, culinary science, computer science, psychology, and many more. More than 1300 SJU students and 250 external participants have enrolled for these courses this year.

Infrastructure Update

In the academic year 2022-23, SJU has completed works on campus amounting to upwards of Rs 3 crore. This includes Rs 93 lakhs on buying new computer systems and setting up new labs, 9 lakhs for the observatory in PG block, and 13 lakhs on library storage improvement alone. Further, nearly 94 lakhs has been spent on renovation works for departments and labs on campus.

Library

SJU Library is the brains of the campus and caters to the needs of

more than 9000 undergraduate, postgraduate, and research-level staff and students. With a mission to provide quality resources and innovative services to stimulate creativity, intellectual curiosity, and facilitate learning and research, the Central Library launched an e-library using 'Knimbus' – a remote authentication system software – on August 4, 2022. On the same day, the Arrupe Library and Research Centre conducted two FDTPs in collaboration with the SJRI.

Scholarships

A total of Rs 16,20,130 was received from private, government, and other benefactors this year. The management has lent support in the form of management scholarships amounting to Rs 1,86,67,000 in 2022-23.

Grants Received

Over this year, we have generated a grant amount of Rs 8,44,280 as seed money grant, and Rs 10,00,000 as VGST grant.

Global Initiatives

The Global Engagement Advisory Committee of St Joseph's University had a series of meetings with a delegation from Seattle University that visited SJU in 2022. This fruitful meeting resulted in various expressions of interest in offering joint courses and conducting short-term courses in exchange mode. Two students from SJU got a chance to do their upcoming semester in overseas Jesuit Universities – Sophia University, Japan, and Loyola University, New Orleans, USA.

Examination Section

All students who were in need of results and certificates for further

studies were provided the same out-of-turn. Out of the 6333 students who appeared in UG courses and 1093 in PG courses, 4724 students in UG and 996 in PG cleared the April 2022 end-semester examinations. The end-semester examination for the odd semester in October registered a total of 5730 students out of which 3883 cleared, registering an average pass percentage of 73. The college conducted centralised Board of Studies meetings for all departments. This exercise helps departments to focus on relevance and quality in their syllabi. The entire work related to the Examination division has been fully computerised. From this academic year, digital evaluation has been introduced and all preliminary works have been completed by the COE.



St Joseph's Research Institute (SJRI)

The primary objective of SJRI is to enable and facilitate research at SJU as well as to set benchmarks and standards for the same. The hallmark of a University is the generation of knowledge through research in diverse domains carried out by its faculty and students. Through their engagements, facilitated by SJRI, we wish to create a scholarly community that spans the widest range of academic domains, making a positive difference in the world. Members of SJRI conducted file visits to 12 eminent institutions to promote Research and Collaboration. SJRI conducted many FDTPs, Lecture Series, and Workshops throughout the year for faculty, research scholars and students. St Joseph's University signed an official MoU with Eurofins on November 15, 2022. Eurofins is a French Group of laboratories headquartered in Luxembourg, providing testing and support services to pharmaceutical, food,

environmental, agriscience, and consumer products industries, and to governments. The MoU has been signed for the usage of instruments worth Rs 2 crore, which will be installed in the lab for research at St Joseph's University. The Laboratory was inaugurated on March 29, 2023.

St Joseph's University inaugurated its PhD program on February 10, 2023. Dr B Thimme Gowda, Vice Chairman, Karnataka State Higher Education Council, and Dr Madheswaran, Head, Institute for Social and Economic Change, Bengaluru, were the chief guests. PhD is offered in over 20 subjects. The first batch of scholars in Botany, Chemistry, Physics, and English started their studies from February 11, 2023.

Certificate Courses

The University offers a wide variety of courses for skill development under the flagship of Credit Courses. These courses are aimed at providing skill and knowledge outside of the academic

syllabi and provide practical and field-based experiences to students. These courses have been part of SJU tradition for over a decade and are now incorporated into the NEP system. Every department of the University offers a unique Credit Course that meets practical employability demands. This year, 51 different courses were offered, which included diversified areas such as cinema, music, dance, martial arts, culinary science, computer science, psychology and many more, to manifest the students' interests into career opportunities. More than 1300 SJU students and more than 250 external participants have enrolled for these courses this year.

FDP

The first day of the academic year in August 2022 was Lexio Brevis which was organised by FDP. On October 10, 2022, the FDP team along with the School of Humanities and Languages organised a session for mentors. The program was called 'Mentorship at SJU: A Transformative Practice'.





The FDP committee, under the guidance of Mr Clement D'Souza, conducted an induction programme for the new faculty members. The main focus of this programme was Jesuit Ethos, teaching, learning and classroom management. JESCOL-1 was conducted by the FDP team from December 8 to 10, 2022 to help newly joined staff members to understand how Jesuits function and how their ideologies, principles, and commitment lead to a better and evolved society.

IQAC

Dr Madappa MB from the Department of Biotechnology was appointed as the first director of the IQAC office for St Joseph's University. Dr Syed Wajeed handed over the charge after 8 years of successful service as the coordinator. Dr Fr Richard Rego SJ, Dr Christo, Mr Kiran Jeevan, and Dr Madappa M.B attended a meeting with Indiana University-Purdue University, Indianapolis (IUPUI) from September 12 to 16, 2022. Dr Fr Victor Lobo,

SJ, Dr Madappa MB, and Mr Kiran Jeevan attended the Uni-Italia India educational conclave organised by the Consulate General of Italy. The team met with Italy's new Consul General in Bengaluru, Alfonso Tagliaferri. After the interaction, Mr Maurizio Tira and Dr Monica Bofardini from University of Brescia, Italy, visited the campus on Dec 9, 2022. Delegates from Loyola College, Chennai, Loyola Academy, Secunderabad, and Maris Stella College, Vijayawada, visited SJU to study the best practices and organisational functioning of the university. The office completed the process of applying for the following rankings: NIRF2023, The Week ranking, and India Today magazine.

AICPA and ACCA

Miles Education, in association with the Department of Management, School of Business at St Joseph's University conducted an exam

for the Certification in Strategic Finance from AICPA

(Association of International Certified Professional Accountants) for final year CMA students of the 2020-2023 batch. AICPA Strategic Finance Program is a subset of the US CMA Program and covers key topics from the CMA Curriculum. Of the 52 students who attended, 37 have cleared, bringing the pass percentage to 71.1 per cent.

ACCA, the global body for professional accountants, conducts examinations 4 times every year during the months of March, June, September, and December. 8 students from the university have been accredited as ACCA affiliates after attempting these intensive papers. The School of Business is proud to have Janvi Dodeja (20IFA009) who has secured Global rank 3 and India rank 1 in Financial Management during the September 2022 attempt of ACCA examination.



Mentorship

The Chancellor has directed the university's administration to train the faculty on basic counselling skills and effective mentoring so that mentors acquire the required skills to guide the mentees. It is the Jesuit perspective that every student passing through the doorways of our institution should obtain good mentorship and care. The university has developed a mentoring record for the first time to execute this approach more effectively and efficiently. This aids in documenting all mentoring activities.

Student Council

The Student Council Election was held on October 11, 2022, at St Joseph's University. A total of 41 students stood for election, ranging from five different posts, namely President, Vice President, General Secretary I, General Secretary II, Treasurer, and Joint Secretary and the Investiture Ceremony for the Student Council was held on October 31. The Chief Guest was Dr Rajeev Howda, ex-Rajya Sabha MP and National Spokesperson for the Indian National Congress. The Vice-Chancellor and Student

Council Governor, Mr Taral Shah, administered the oath.

St Joseph's University Student Council hosted the first ever Youth Week which was conducted on January 16, 2023.

The University successfully celebrated the amalgam of energy and diversity through Prathibha 2023: Intra-university fest from January 30 to February 28, 2023.

SJU's annual festival, Visages, was held on March 24 and 25, 2023. The fest was themed around street style and was attended by students from various colleges across Bangalore.

Fresher's Day for the Shift 3 students was organised on October 6, 2022 in the main auditorium to welcome the students to the university.

Parents' Council

The SJU Parents Council conducted a workshop on 'Adolescent Mental Health and Effective Parenting Strategies' along with Parent Council Elections on November 5, 2022. Dr Manjula V from Christ University was the invited speaker. The speaker emphasised the significance of open and direct communication patterns in

family, healthy decision-making, and the need for quality time with adolescents.

PRO

The PRO (Public Relations Office) hosted several events during the past year to engage with the local community and promote healthcare, education, and entrepreneurship with events such as Health Camps, Eye Check-ups, Placement Fairs, collaborations with Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, and a Start-up Mela. The talk series Open Heart, organised on February 27, 2023, featured two notable speakers – singer Mr Raghu Dixit and activist Ms Sharmila Irom on February 15, 2023. Corporate Genesis was held on February 27, 2023. Former Governor Ms Margaret Alva and businessman Mr Irfan Razack were the chief guests of the event. Neerathon 2022 was a one-day event held at St Joseph's University on May 8, 2022 to raise awareness about water conservation and promote sustainable water management practices. The event was organised by the University's Wildlife Awareness and Conservation Club (WACC) along with the PRO.

Placements

The placement drive was a great success with an overall placement rate of 87 per cent. The highest CTC offered to our students this year was Rs. 21 lakhs per annum. The Placement Office of SJU co-hosted seven webinars and talks with industry leaders. As of today, we have a total of 256 companies that are associated with SJU placement. These companies come from various industries such as IT, manufacturing, healthcare, hospitality, and many more.

Women's Cell

Women's Cell conducted a weeklong event UDAAN from March 1 to 8, 2023 to celebrate International Women's Day in the university auditorium. Chief guests was Ms Sanjana, a Product Developer, and guest of honour, Dr Subhashini Muthu Krishnan. The event consisted of a panel discussion and a guest talk by Ms Geeta Menon, Founder of Stree Jagruti Samiti, which was followed by a cultural programme.

Campus Ministry

The Campus Ministry at St Joseph's University is a vibrant team of teaching faculty who

take care of the corporal and spiritual needs of students and staff members through weekly masses, important occasions, and organising various workshops and conferences. This year, the Campus Ministry organised Diwali Celebrations at the University Auditorium on October 27, 2022, in the spirit of celebrating 'Unity in Diversity.' St Joseph's University had its first Christmas celebration on December 23, 2022, in an enthusiastic gathering of faculty, staff and students enthralled by Christmas carols rendered by the newly constituted University choir, Nightingale 2.0. The event had a Christmas message delivered by Ms Parul Batra, and Pro-Chancellor Fr Swebert D'Silva, SJ, in his address, reiterated the need for the spirit of caring and sharing in our troubled world today.

This year, The Igniters programme was conducted from January 12 to 24, 2023. The sessions were conducted for all students across all three shifts, with 70 volunteer resource persons leading 6 sessions each for the students over the two-day period. Igniters 2023 achieved its motto of "A Fire that Kindles other Fires,"

and uniquely enhanced the students' intellectual and moral development. The involvement of diverse resource persons contributed to the quality of the program. The sessions covered topics such as Conflict Management and Decision Making, Creative and Critical Thinking, Love and Infatuation, Stress Management and Self-care, and Career Guidance.

Outreach

Bembala is the Outreach division of SJU. Students are taught the importance of community service and how we can help those who are less privileged. Some of the major projects taken by Bembala during the year 2022-23 include Vigilance Awareness Week; Children's Day celebrations; rural exposure camps to Sindagi and Manvi; paper bag making and distribution to local shops; Traffic Awareness Drive, and many more. Bembala has received awards for the following - Anti-drug Campaign from the Excise Department, Government of Karnataka, and World Earth Day Climate Change Rally by the Ministry of Youth and Sports Affairs, Government of Karnataka.





Josephite Choir

The Josephite Choir is blessed with immensely talented singers and saw a lot of new talented singers and musicians this year too. Mr Leonard Winston Aiman and Ms Joy Keren are the coordinators of the Josephite Choir. This year, the Choir has about 250 students singing for the greater glory of God. The choir started its journey this year from Glorious Festival of Harmony, a national level choir festival hosted by Glorious Choir, Bengaluru. The Josephite Choir performed in front of the Honourable President of India, during her visit to inaugurate St Joseph's University.

NSS

The activities are undertaken at SJU-NSS aim towards the overall development of the students, by empowering them through workshops. This year activities like blood donation camps, plantation drives, cleanliness drives, awareness drives, helping the people from low socioeconomic status by making them aware of their rights, helped fuel the

students' social concern. NSS Exposure Camp was organised to help volunteers to understand the socio-economic and cultural conditions of rural life. The camp also helps to inculcate the true sense of oneness and understand the cultural rural knowledge.

SJU Sports Day

The University conducted the 139th Annual Athletic Meet on February 17, 2023 in the University grounds. The chief guest was Mr Charles D'Souza, a national-level hockey player. There were many events conducted including 4x100 metres relay for the staff both teaching and non teaching. SJU also organised SPORTSTAKES 2023, an Inter-College Sports Fest from April 10 to April 13, 2023 for 11 different games - Badminton, Basketball, Carrom, Chess, Football, Handball, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Table Tennis, Throwball and Volleyball.

NCC

Lt Akshay D Mandlik – is the only ANO in the country to be part of Youth Exchange Program 2022,

Delhi, and was the recipient of the highest NCC Award, Raksha Mantri Padak, by Ministry of Defence, Govt of India.

Cadet Sergeant (CDT/SGT) V Sai Subramanian represented the Karnataka and Goa Directorate at the Republic Day Camp 2023. He is the All-India Best Cadet gold medalist (air wing, SD). He is an excellent 0.22 firer and proficient in academics and extracurriculars.

CDT Mandeep Singh secured a Gold Medal during the IDSSC Shooting Camp.




INAUGURATION OF ST JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY

St Joseph's University was officially inaugurated on September 27, 2022, by Smt Droupadi Murmu, the Hon'ble President of India, in the august presence of several eminent guests that included Sri Thaawarchand Gehlot, Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka, Sri Basavaraj Bommai, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Karnataka, Sri CN Ashwath Narayan, Hon'ble Minister for Higher Education of

Lexio Brevis

ALUMNI / AE ASSOCIATION REPORT



AAROHA– INDIAN SOLO SINGING

Aaroha was an Indian solo singing competition judged by Ms Vidya Ramachandran and Ms Preksha Bharadwaj. The event saw a whopping 117 participants battle out on February 6, 2023. The finals saw 32 participants qualify on February 13, 2023. Judged by Vid Roopa Srikanth, the event saw students showcase their talent through their melodious voices.

MEHFIL– INDIAN GROUP MUSIC

Providing a stage for talent and a break from monotony is the essence behind Mehfil, an event where students explored their musical

talents. Hosted on February 20, 2023, fabulous performances put up by 20 teams and applause from the audience marked the event judged by Ms Preksha Bharadwaj. 11 teams qualified to reach the finals hosted on February 27, 2023. Judged by Mr Pranesh and Mr Tanush, the event was marked by exemplary talent showcased through a variety of songs of languages from every corner of the country. Despite unforeseen circumstances, the event turned out to be a major success. CADENZA– WESTERN SOLO SINGING

Cadenza, the Western solo singing competition, took place over four rounds, prelims - Anima, Susprium, and Bends, and finals - Arpeggi on January 30 and 31, 2023. Ice Breakers was held on March 24 in the university auditorium.

The event was organised by MIMA Association, and two teams from St Joseph College of Commerce and Presidency University participated in the event. This was the first edition of Aero India where the world's stealthiest aircraft Lockheed Martin F-35 performed in the air show. The air show also involved exhibition of the might of various other renowned military aircraft like F-16 Falcon, LCA Tejas, LCH Prachand and Dakota. The helicopter air display team of the IAF Sarang and the aerobatic display team of the IAF Surya Kiran also performed in this air show. The air show was later followed by an orientation on career opportunities in the IAF by the officers of the force and cadets visited the Museum of the Air Force Station. This air show gave a memorable experience and some knowledge of military aviation.

Unit Skeet Shooting

On the 1st of March, 2023, 11 Cadets of 1 KAR AIR SQN SJU, reported to Unit, at Jakkur Aerodrome, at 9:00 am. The

cadets conducted the cleaning of the microlights stationed at the aerodrome. Cadets were also briefed about how to use fire extinguishers and handle situations during fire accidents. IDSSC Selections

A TALE OF TWO ELEPHANTS

The forests of Southern India are critical for the conservation of many threatened large mammals, but they have high-density human populations. Situated in the Eastern Ghats, the Bannerghatta National Park (BNP) protects roughly 256 sq km and is just 22 km south of Bangalore, India's third most populous city. It is part of the country's largest scrub forests and is a critical landscape as it connects to larger forest tracts in the South, providing an undisturbed link between the Eastern and Western Ghats. Community is essential to conservation, and therefore, there is a requirement for sensitization and collaboration among local key factions. A Rocha India's conservation programs are largely based on mitigation measures reducing the threat of human-animal conflict in the highly fragmented landscape of the Bannerghatta National Park.

About 25 volunteers visited A Rocha India First Field Study on November 12, 2022, to take part in an orientation programme and listen to researchers share their field experiences working with elephants. Conservation in India depends upon the support of future generations. Such education programs are based on a hands-on approach to understanding the reality and challenges facing our natural heritage. The Kasserguppe Field Study Centre is a fully functional rustic house set amidst the local community where one can enjoy getting away from the hustle and bustle of city life.

NSS CELL INAUGURAL CEREMONY

The 53rd Inaugural Ceremony of all five units of the NSS was held on November 19, 2022, at 3 pm. The event was conducted offline at the University Auditorium. The Chief Guest of the event was Dr Shalini Rajneesh, IAS. The event was also graced by Shri Prathap Lingaiah, GoK, Shri YM Uppin, GoI, and Mr Selwyn Paul, NSS Program Coordinator. The event was met with great success with more than 500 volunteers taking part in it.

NATIONAL CONSTITUTION DAY

On November 26, 2022, the Loyola Hall hosted a seminar featuring guest speaker Mr Vasanth, Advocate, Karnataka High Court, who discussed various aspects of the Indian Constitution and the fundamental rights of its citizens. Mr Vasanth highlighted the recent amendments made to the Indian Constitution and the contemporary challenges

they pose to modern India. He also spoke of the challenges of money and muscle power and the importance of nurturing secularism and linguistic pluralism. The purpose of fundamental rights is to establish the rule of law and protect individual dignity. The seminar also addressed challenges to fundamental rights, including lack of information, adjustments that comply with the wrong, no critical thinking in choosing representatives, decriminalisation on the basis of religion, privatisation in government, and citizens not casting their votes or using NOTA. Mr Thakur spoke about the politics of defections and the state intervening in interstate freedom of religion. He stressed that freedom of religion is a progressive and liberal area. The event was successful, with 25 volunteers participating.

NATIONAL YOUTH WEEK

The volunteers were welcomed for the first session of the new semester on January 16, 2023 in Loyola Hall. The first year volunteers were then briefed about SEC classes and their questions were answered. After that, the 75 volunteers were divided into 12 teams for a group activity. A few sub topics were chosen based on the qualities of youth: communication, education, patience, self control, motivation/self esteem, mental health, dreams, responsibility, leadership, volunteering, positive thinking and teamwork. Each team was supposed to choose one leader from their group and the selected leaders had to pick-up three chits from

This was the first online webinar of the semester after the college was officially announced as a university, under the guidance of Vinay M, University Representative, unit two. The speaker for the program was Ms Veena Nirmala from the Mathematics department. A quiz based on Karnataka and NSS followed the webinar. WALKATHON

In collaboration with the Election Commission of India, a walkathon was organised to spread awareness about adding names to the Voter List and about voting. Volunteers were called on to participate in the event and create awareness. The walkathon began from Cubbon Park Main Gate, Hudson Circle, followed by Central Library, Karnataka High Court, Vidhana Soudha, Press Club, and finally ended at Bala Bhavan Front End. Participants were briefed on the vote before the start of the event. Menstrual Myths

First Aid Awareness

Loosen any tight clothing, such as a collar or belt. First aid can make the difference between life and death in an emergency situation. Prompt and effective first aid can stabilize a person’s condition and prevent further harm. First aid can help to reduce the severity of injuries and minimize the risk of complications. This can lead to faster recovery times and better outcomes for the person affected. The event was then concluded

with a vote of thanks to our Vice Chancellor, Rev Fr Dr Victor Lobo SJ, NSS Executive Officer, Mr Selwyn, NSS Unit 2 Program Office Ms Raj Kiran CA.

On November 24 - 25, 2022, in the Chancery Pavilion on Residency Road in Bengaluru, Dr Madappa MB attended the QS I-GAUGE India Academic Forum.

On December 16, 2022, Dr Madappa MB participated in the online discussion about the QS I-GAUGE Rating, India for St Joseph's University. Officials from St Joseph's University took part in this conversation. The first and only Independent Education Rating System in India is QS I-GAUGE, a division of QS Quacquarelli Symonds, UK.

Fr Richard Rego, Dr Christo, Kiran Jeevan, and Dr Madappa MB attended the conference with Indiana University-Purdue University, Indianapolis at the Four Seasons hotel from September 12–16, 2022. The American Education Trade Mission to India was in charge of planning the event.

Fr Dr Victor Lobo SJ, Dr Madappa MB, and Mr Kiran Jeevan attended the Consulate General of Italy's Uni-Italia India Educational Conclave. Alfonso Tagliaferri, Italy's new Consul General in Bengaluru, met with the team. Following the engagement, Mr Maurizio Tira and Dr Monica Bofardini from the University of Brescia in Italy paid a visit to the campus on December 9, 2022. The delegation went to the university's library, outreach, and research departments.

Documentation and Ranking

The IQAC office prepared the file for the NIRF India Ranking 2023. Some of the important highlights of NIRF data submitted from the year 2021-2022 contain a total



student strength of 7870. The 1396 UG and 397 PG students have passed out in a minimal stipulated time in the 2022 pass out batch.

Among them 718 students have taken up jobs and 310 students have opted for higher education. Rupees 58,45,290 was spent on library assets. Rupees 1,26,36,890 alone was spent in academic infrastructure, consumables and other running expenditures. Rupees 37, 71,61,146 was spent on salaries. Rupees 1,93,09,968 was spent on capital assets. Rupees 37,88,669 was sponsored by five funding agencies for research. 594 students received the management scholarships and 188 students received scholarships from the private bodies, state and central government schemes. 34 MOU have been signed by the university.

The NIRF application and documents was presented to the college officials by Dr. Syed Wajeed and Dr. Madappa.MB

The applications and supporting documents for NIRF overall, India Today magazine ranking for Arts, Science, Commerce, Mass Communication, MSW and BCA

and The Week magazine ranking for Arts, Science, and Commerce and Mass Communication was prepared and submitted by the IQAC office.

Delegates from various colleges visited the university. Teachers from Loyola Academy, Secunderabad, Maris Stella College, Vijayawada, MS Ramaiah College, Bengaluru visited the university.

The IQAC office launched the evaluation of teaching criteria of staff by students for the odd semester 2022-23. Constructive feedback talks have begun. An evaluation of the department's online OE courses was conducted. A two-tiered examination was planned. Staff members reviewed OE courses for the online video and notes they generated.

The Director presided over the meeting of the class IQAC representatives. The review of recommendations and concerns is now underway. The team is forming external members for the university's Greater IQAC team. Following the completion of the procedure, the university's first bigger IQAC meeting will be held.

SJRI Activities

The research institute's name was changed to St Joseph's Research Institute. The institute's vision is to use research to investigate, analyse, and evaluate various domains of reality in nature and society.

SJRI's primary goal is to enable and facilitate research at SJU. SJRI would provide infrastructure, industry-academia interface, seed money funding for faculty at the early stages of their careers, faculty training programmes, and seminars and symposia on current thrust areas, in addition to facilitating doctoral programmes.

The following are the SJRI research activities for the year 2022:

To promote research and collaboration, the institute has made field visits to Ashoka Trust for Research In Ecology And The Environment (ATREE), The

University of Trans-Disciplinary Health Sciences and Technology (TDU), JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI), Indian Institute of Science, Indian Space Research Organisation, Karnataka State Pollution Control Board, Azim Premji University, Karnataka State Open University for Distance Learning, University of Mysore, Yuvaraja's College, Indian Social Institute, Raman Research Institute.

The journey of the institute began on March 5 and 6, 2022, with the conference "Jesuits in Science Forum" in the Board Room. A session on "Research Tools and Applications" was held on August 4, 2022 in Xavier Hall, and "SJU'S Milestones towards Research and Publications" was held on August 22, 2022 in the SJU Auditorium, Xavier Hall, Loyola Hall, and Central Library. The institute held a lecture-cum-discussion on Credible Research

Publications on October 13 and 14, 2022, in Xavier Hall.

SJU signed an Official MOU with Eurofins in Xavier Hall on November 15, 2022, at 3:00 pm, paving the way for active collaborative research while also advancing the vision of innovation and creativity. On January 14, 2023, SJRI held another Faculty Development Training Programme (FDTP) titled "Use and Application of Plagiarism Detection Software."

SJU launched its Ph.D. programme on February 10, 2023. Mr B. Thimme Gowda, Vice Chairman, Karnataka State Higher Education Council, and Mr S. Madheswaran, Head, Institute for Social and Economic Change, Bengaluru, were the chief guests. There are over 20 Ph.D. programmes offered.

Faculty Development Training Programme (FDTP) – "Use and Application of Plagiarism Detection Software"



On January 14 2023, a Faculty Development Training Programme was organised in the Central Library. The topic for the same was the use and application of plagiarism detection software.

PhD Program Inauguration

St. Joseph's University, Bengaluru inaugurated its PhD program on February 10 2023. Prof. B. Thimme Gowda, Vice Chairman of Karnataka State Higher Education Council and Prof. S. Madheswaran, head of the Institute for Social and Economic Change, Bengaluru were the chief guests. PhD is offered in over 20 subjects, and admission is done twice a year in July and January with a monthly stipend offered to full-time scholars. Out of 46 applicants for the PhD programme, 40 were shortlisted for interview and 19 were admitted. The first batch of students in Botany, Chemistry, Physics and English started their studies on 11th February 2023.

Workshop – “Conservation of Biodiversity and Medicinal Plants in India”

On March 27 2023, a workshop titled “Conservation of Biodiversity and Medicinal Plants in India” was organised for the PhD scholars and the P.G. students of Social Sciences, St. Joseph's University.

Inauguration of the Eurofins Laboratory

On March 29, 2023, an analytical chemistry laboratory, a collaboration between St. Joseph's University and the Eurofins group of companies was inaugurated. The initiative was part of the Eurofins group's Eurofins Advinus, Eurofins Analytical Services and Eurofins Amar Immunodiagnostics, a CSR programme. It was part of the company's effort to support the Atma Nirbhar programme of India that aims to develop human capital.

Placement Office



With an overall placement rate of 87 per cent, St Joseph's University placement drive was a huge success in the year 2022-23. This accomplishment is a result of the students, faculty members, and SJU's Placement Office's hard work and dedication.

Skill Development Training Programs

SJU's Placement Office held four skill development training programmes to improve students' employability in various areas including technical, soft skills, and personality development.

Highest CTC Offered

As of today, 256 companies are associated with SJU placement. This year, the highest CTC offered to our students was Rs. 21 lakhs per year.

Josephite HIRE Josephite

The Josephite HIRE Josephite, an online student portal, provides students with access to the most recent job opportunities and allows students to connect with employers and apply for various job openings.

Webinars and Talks

The Placement Office co-hosted seven webinars and discussions with industry leaders such as Cognizant and Wipro. These sessions provided students with valuable insights into the industry and helped them understand the latest trends and requirements of the job market.

876 of its students took the Wheebox National Employability Test. Of these, 73 per cent of our students received

a high percentile on the test indicating that they are prepared to enter the labour force.

Representatives from several regional colleges gathered at SJU for an Inter College Placement Officers Meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to create a platform for placement officers to share information. The SJU Placement Office proposed the establishment of a forum to facilitate information sharing among college placement officers. The forum will be used for discussions, brainstorming solutions, and sharing placement strategies. Representatives from the meeting welcomed the proposal and agreed to participate actively in the forum.



The Philatelists and Numismatists Association at St Joseph's University is a professional forum for faculty and students interested in philately, numismatics, and notaphily. Mr G Anuplal (Associate Professor and HOD of Industrial Relations) and Mr Deepak Kannan (Final Year B.Sc.) were unanimously elected President and General Secretary of PANA on September 17, 2022. Returning Officers for the PANA Election were Mr Clement D'Souza and Dr A Maria.

On February 4, 2023, our Alumni Association's Centenary Special Postal Cover was released. With the release of this cover, St. Joseph's now has the distinction of being an institution of higher education in Karnataka to have two special commemorative postal covers and a commemorative postage stamp with First Day Cover to its name.

The Annual Philately And Numismatics Workshop-2022

was held on November 28, 2022. CRISYS 112: Term / Research Paper: Research In The Natural Sciences

On July 7, 2022, a webinar was held by the Centre for Research and Innovation in Systems of Social Sciences, Applied Sciences and Sustainability (CRISYS) of St Joseph's University. Alumni of St Joseph's University, Mr Darshan and Ms Naksha were invited as speakers for the event "CRISYS 112: Term /Research Paper: Research in the Natural Sciences".

A welcome address was followed by the introduction of the Biotech Collective, the functioning of CRISYS and of the speakers.

Ms Naksha, from Radboud University, Netherlands began by highlighting the importance

of the primary decision to be made regarding the focus of the research, whether it was broad or narrow. She brought out the differences between a review article and a research proposal, concluding with a discussion on the writing process. Mr Darshan, from the University of Hyderabad, listed prerequisites to beginning research, such as good observation skills, patience, identifying a research topic etc. He recommended a SWOT (Strength, Weakness, Opportunities, and Threats) analysis to identify a field of interest. He familiarised the audience with the key steps to research: doing a detailed literature survey, discovering the literature gap, a research gap to design a project, and finally identifying loopholes.

This was followed by a quality discussion about the fundamentals and comparison of research in India and abroad followed by a question-and-answer round. The event was concluded with a vote of thanks.

The address was followed by a speech by Dr M Jayashankar, Coordinator of CRISYS, who touched upon the history of the association. from online databases like JSTOR, N-LIST, DELNET, and the DSpace Digital Library and Institutional Repository. CRISYS Economics Collective Launch

showcasing their perspectives.




HINDI PARISHAD

National Conference

Writing Worlds, Worlds Writing:
New Textualities and Their
Online Lives

The Department of English hosted the third edition of the annual conference Writing Worlds, Worlds Writing: New Textualities and their Online Lives from March 20 to 25, 2023 in a hybrid mode that incorporated both online and offline sessions. The conference structure involved plenaries, paper presentations, and workshops that were conducted by staff and external resource persons. The conference began with online plenary sessions for the first three days, involving resource persons such as the prolific science fiction writer Mr Samit Basu, Dr Nina Sabnani who discussed storying memories, and Dr Basil N Darlong Diengdoh who spoke on the theoretical foundations of post-humanism. The permanent theme, new textualities, invited discussion on evolving textualities in online

spaces, with deliberations on speculative fiction, narratives in video games, as well as a return to the graphic medium. Offline sessions of the conference, which began on March 23, saw participation from external institutions and independent scholars who attended plenaries and workshops, and delivered paper presentations.

Plenaries involved writers, academicians and creative practitioners. Appupen and Falah Faisal had a conversation on the emergence of graphic narratives in India, a topic which was later critically examined by Dr Preetha Vasan. Gautam Shenoy and Vinayak Varma participated in a panel discussion on the status of speculative fiction in South Asia. The conversational mode of these plenaries gave an opportunity for open discussion and questions from the audience. The workshops were very interactive and activity-based. The conference and its components hinged on the idea that narratives evolve into newer forms when interacting

with digital media, including the way that the consumers respond to and receive newer media. For instance, the reactions to digital art gradually built a more conducive environment for online art as described by Ms Sreejita Biswas, a digital artist who operates under the pseudonym Solo.

Eight workshops were hosted during the conference, with one on QAMRA and archiving. RP Amudhan hosted two sessions of his mobile phone filmmaking workshop titled “When Ordinairness Transcends Margins”. Ms Drishti Rakhra conducted her workshop on “Reading Queer Domesticities”. Dr Arul Mani investigated “Flash Guerdon” while Mr Vinayak Varma hosted a workshop on “Illustration in Speculative Fiction”. A workshop on fanfiction by Ms Cynthia Nirmala Rajah took place on the second day of the conference which ended with Ms Vismaya Vishwa’s workshop on “Instamacy”. The final workshop of the conference titled



“Recasting Film: Responding to Caste in Popular Cinema” was organised by Ms Vijeta Kumar.

The conference also included four panels of paper presentations with a multitude of papers being accepted from undergraduate and postgraduate students, as well as research scholars and independent researchers. The papers broadly explored the diverse forms of writing, textualization and narrativization that happen within new media. These explorations, within the broader ambit of digital humanities, looked at a huge variety of topics - from multimedia storytelling to AI-generated love letters, from video game narratives to online fandoms, from new pedagogic practices to performative practices in social media.

The conference concluded with a summary of the themes and research topics presented at the conference, with ideas for a future conference. This was followed by a valedictory session and presentation of certificates.

ASSOCIATION REPORTS

The Literary Society

META 2023

The annual Josephite festival of literature, Meta, hosted by the Department of English at St Joseph's University was conducted this year between February 6 and 16, in a hybrid mode that involved both offline events as well as online discussions. This is the eleventh edition of META.

The festival hosted flagship contests such as the Prof. T. R. H. Peck Memorial Lecture Contest, the Nicholas Parsons Trophy for JAM, and the St Joseph's University Prize for the Personal Essay, formerly the Prof. Barbra Naidu Prize for the Personal Essay. The festival also hosted the T. G. Vaidyanathan Film Review Contest, the Fr. Hedwig Da Costa Memorial Shakespeare Elocution Contest, as well as two quizzes, Bookends and Ott-aku.



In addition, the festival consisted of engaging workshops conducted by Dr Arul Mani, Ms Vijeta Kumar, Ms Nikhita Thomas, as well as notable writers Ms Amulya Shruti, and Ms Nisha Susan.

The schedule also featured conversations with renowned writers Ms Khyrunnisa, Ms Paromita Vohra, Ms Vasudhendhra, and Ms Jugal Mody, alongside a series of discussions with alumni such as Ms Shefali Mathew, Ms Zenisha Gonsalves, and Ms Ila Ananya. Furthermore, theatre artist Ms Mallika Prasad delivered an interactive lec-dem on her life in theatre. A student panel of the Department's students in collaboration with members of the Literary Society at Mount Carmel College offered insights into how young women learnt to exist and navigate spaces, while another student contribution was the Public Communications exhibit brought out by students of MA English. Additionally, a demonstration on how ChatGPT could influence quizzing was delivered.

The next edition of META will be held in August 2023.

METONYM 2022

The 9th edition of Metonym, the inter-class literary championship was conducted from September 29 to October 8, 2022. The five associations of the Department of English came together to host events in writing, performance, quizzing, and art contests. A total of 13 events were held.

The theme of Metonym 2022 was 'Grooving On', an extension from last year's theme - 'On your Feet'. The theme symbolised moving on



from a pandemic-stricken world and going back to the offline world again after two years of online learning.

The Literary Society conducted three events: Takedown, Fandom Menace and the Art Essay. Takedown involved writing three paragraphs to take down an overrated topic. Here, it was either chicken biriyani or Instagram. Fandom Menace encouraged participants to bring together literary/fictional characters and spin their own story based on a line about an excellent meal of boiled potatoes. Art Essay sought to combine the two different skills of illustrating and writing based on the prompt: 'Staying at Home.'

SJU Nous, an association that encourages conversations around media and culture held three events: Nose Cut, Counterpoint, and News Reading. Nose Cut saw multiple personalities such as Bappi Lahiri, President Xi Jinping, Winnie the Pooh, Roger Federer, Rashmika, and Rahul Gandhi come together in the same room and ask each other questions. Counterpoint involved coming up with a response to controversial statements from books or famous quotations. News Reading tested participants' ability to read the news while a distraction committee danced,

sang, and performed all sorts of nonsense to interrupt their flow.

The SJU Linguistics Society conducted two events: What's The Good Word? - a word game that encouraged participants to think outside the box and Spelling Bee, an event that saw two rounds - the first one involving clues about cinema and film making while the other was held in the standard spelling bee format.

The Performing Arts Society held two events: JAM aka Just A Minute where students spoke about various topics for a minute with no hesitation, no deviation, and no repetition; and Bhoot Polish where participants recounted a horror story accompanied by flashing lights and music from a ukelele.

The SJU Quizzers conducted two events: 20 Questions – a quiz whose questions were incredibly random and saw participants racking their brains while trying to guess the answer and the Freshers Quiz which was one meant for the first years of both the undergraduate and postgraduate courses.

The valedictory was held on October 8, 2022. The rolling trophy was won by III EJP B, with I MA ENG coming in second and II MA ENG coming third.



Writing Desk

“What does writing mean to you?” – This was the question that sparked the inauguration of the Writing Desk in November 2022. As people started talking openly about their relationships with writing, the chilly Bangalore weather that had been hanging over room A314 slowly dissipated. Ms Cynthia, who conducted Writing Desk, spoke about her complex yet loving connection with writing. During the session, students shared how writing is often a space of vulnerability, honesty and the expression of the self. These discussions illustrated how writing unites the personal, the social and political spheres. One of the intriguing observations made and shared was how tiny activities like preparing a cup of tea for your loved one are also a type of writing and how writing can be synonymous with love. The participants also talked about how writing may be used to archive and navigate memories, including false memories and intense emotions like grief.

The second session of Writing Desk held on Friday, January 20, 2023 had students turning up in staggering numbers, brought together by their love for writing. Ms Cynthia talked about the magic of making mistakes and that it is

completely fine to feel that our writing is terrible. All good writers always complain about their writing not being good enough. The students were given two prompts to work on: a letter to someone you don't talk to anymore, and colours of people in your life. The participants captured the mundane such as untied shoelaces, butterflies, and clouds among other things very beautifully in their write-ups. The listeners found pieces of themselves in the others' writings.

The third session of the Writing Desk took place on January 29, 2023, a Sunday. Interested students gathered at Bookworm to write on the theme of the SJU Prize for the Personal Essay: Songs I've Forgotten. They were joined by two students from the Army Institute of Fashion and Design. Participants read out their work, and gave each other very enthusiastic feedback on their write-ups while enjoying



the coffee very graciously prepared for them by Bookworm.

The Linguistics Society

ΣΑμᾶντικς 2023

ΣΑμᾶντικς 2023, organised by the Department of English and the Linguistics Society, was a festival that celebrated languages and linguistics. The festival, which took place from March 30 to April 1 was an incredible three days of engaging discussions, unique contests (which involved speaking, writing, design, or quiz), exciting workshops and fun quizzes that gained us all new insights and perspectives.

The 3-day extravaganza started with the prompt for the Mother Language Essay Contest that celebrated the beauty of languages and cultures by providing a platform for writers to express themselves in their native tongue. The competition boasted participation from quite a few colleges from other states. Participants in the Stan-fiction Contest looked at the evolution of language by rewriting a piece in Gen-Z lingo. The Letter Designing Contest was a visual delight, with participants showcasing their calligraphy skills and artistic creativity. Spellunked had the participants and the other attendees scrambling to create as many words as possible from a given set of letters. In Trigger

Lee, participants tried to defend the existence of some words, and argued why certain words and phrases like “Hello” should not exist with great glee. Punnykutty saw participants making puns in stressful situations. Zine making invited them to design colourful, creative zines based on the prompt “Summery”. In JAM, students had to speak without hesitation and repetition about the assigned topic, albeit with a linguistic constraint like the first five words of their JAM speech being the words of a song. Quizzers had to decode cryptic clues in the quickest time possible in Wordnik, Amor and Tongues and Weird-E-Alam. These were challenging events that had the participants flexing their linguistic muscles and showing off their problem-solving skills.

Chirag Chittar talked about bridging the gap between natural sciences and social sciences in the fest. The workshops conducted as part of the festival invited the students to develop skills such as photography, decoding cryptic clues, journalling the everyday by drawing and writing, writing flash fiction, and analysing music. SAMæntiks 2023 combined learning and fun in its events and workshops.

2022-23 was a big year for SJU NOUS. Programmes for the semester were kick-started with



the Social Justice Film Festival, organised in collaboration with renowned documentary filmmaker RP Amudhan. Held over the course of two days, the Social Justice Film Festival saw over 15 documentaries screened, dealing with themes such as the Partition, the effects of caste in our country, the treatment of refugees and more. Several other filmmakers such as Basav Biradar and Bani Singh were also in attendance.


The Performing Arts Society

These were run in collaboration with the Linguistics Society, for SAMæntiks 2023, the linguistics festival.



International Conference on English Teaching: A Report

‘Communing towards a pedagogy of hope and transformation’, an international conference on English Teaching, was held on June 8th, 9th, and 10th in the De Nobili Hall, St Joseph’s University. The event brought together educators, scholars, and professionals from various fields to explore learning through teaching.

The conference began with Ms Vijetha, of the Department of

English, speaking about what got her students engaged in the learning process. She emphasised the power of effective teaching methods in fostering curiosity and passion. Dr Arul Mani, Dean of the School of Languages and Literatures, discussed the National Education Policy (NEP) and its implications. He expressed concern that the NEP was primarily designed with a metropolitan mindset, overlooking unique challenges faced by students in other areas.

Dr Arul Mani said that a key objective of the conference

was to equip attendees with the necessary skills to become effective teachers. He asked, “What should we market in a diverse classroom?” This highlighted the need to adapt teaching strategies to accommodate the many backgrounds and learning styles of students.

Plenary sessions featured speakers Dr Srikanth Mallavarapu, Dr Vanamala Vishwanatha, Dr Avinash Thambarisi, Dr SV Srinivas, Ms Aparna Vinod, Dr Charles Tung, and Dr Esra Öztarhan who shared experiences, research findings, and innovative teaching methodologies. Panel discussions saw Dr Cheriyan Alexander and Dr Etienne Rasendran recalling the ELT Community, while members of the Third Eye Portal: Mayookh Barua, Sejal Rathwa, and Durga spoke about negotiating multiple languages in the English classroom.

Researchers from across the country presented papers on teacher ethnographies and opened up questions on artificial intelligence and ChatGPT, impact of lockdown on learning, the effect English language has on culture and on other languages, theatre and performance as teaching methods, and more. Meanwhile, workshops offered by the faculty members explored themes highlighted during the opening speeches.

Dr Mini Mark Bonjour, the HoD of the Department of English, and Dr Arul Mani spoke at the valedictory of the conference, and expressed hope that the conference will become a fixture on the academic calendar.


Inauguration Ceremony



A faculty development programme was conducted over three days starting August 29, September 7, and September 14,



Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is an initiative by the Government of India to commemorate and celebrate the country's 75 years of independence and the glorious history of its people, culture, and accomplishments. On this occasion, the Department of History and Parishodhana, the History Association of St. Joseph's University, conducted a

series of vibrant events to honour the historic celebrations of India 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.' On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, from October 17 to 21, 2022, the series comprised a week's worth of exciting and creative events. Students from a variety of schools participated in each event with great zeal. This department effort allowed students to demonstrate their abilities in various fields and was eventually a successful endeavour with over 60 registrations and participants in numerous activities.

Online Inter-Collegiate Paper Presentation Competition

On October 22, 2022, the Department of History and the History Association, Parishodhana, conducted an online intercollegiate paper presentation competition to commemorate the 75th anniversary of Indian independence. The presentation's theme was 'People and Places

Associated with Indian Freedom Struggle', which elicited a resounding response from students. This event was held to celebrate the sacrifices and efforts of the individuals and locations crucial to our nation's struggle for independence. Dr Paul Newman, Faculty from Department of History, St. Joseph's University gave the welcome address, and Ms Jane D'Souza, Head of Department at SJU, Bengaluru, handled the competition. The competition was judged by Dr Nalini Sekaran, Associate Professor and Head of Department of History at Jyoti Nivas College, (Autonomous) Bengaluru, as well as Mr Mahesh DK, Faculty from Department of History at SJU Bengaluru. College students presented 22 research papers within and outside the state. The winners of the Paper Presentation Competition from St. Joseph's University, Mount Carmel College and Jyoti Nivas College were compensated.



Educational Trip To Bijapur, Aihole, Badami, Pattadakal And Hampi

The very first educational tour of the department was held from January 4 to 6, 2023. Around 30 students in their III and II years of BA visited several historically significant sites in Karnataka. Bagalkote's Kudalasangama and Almatti Dam were the initial destinations. On the second day, the group witnessed the magnificence of the Chalukyan heartland, which included the Badami caverns, Aihole, and Pattadakallu. Exploring these three historic wonders allowed the students to proudly recall the accomplishments of the 6th to 8th century Chalukyan empire. The trip ended with a visit to the capital of the Vijayanagara Empire, Hampi. The students were accompanied by Ms Jane D'Souza, Head of Department of History and Ms Ann Francis,

Faculty of the Economics Department.

Guest Lectures

On February 9, 2023, the Department hosted a guest lecture titled "Career Opportunities in History." Mr Rahul Yadav, a HEP Alumnus from the 2016-2019 Class, was the resource person. Currently, he is a Lecturer at the St. Joseph's Pre-University College in Bangalore. He is an instructor of communicative English at AARIT Academy, an instructor of life skills at PRAJNA Foundation, and an academic counsellor at APTECH Learning. Students were exposed to numerous Humanities-related employment paths. The presentation was followed by an engaging question-and-answer session.

A guest lecture on the theme 'The Making of the Indian Constitution – A Historical Perspective' was held on March 4, 2023. The

distinguished speaker was Dr Bernard D'Sami, Retd Professor, Former HOD of History, Loyola College Chennai and Director of Loyola Institute of Social Science Training and Research (LISSTAR). The talk addressed the diverse perspectives and roles of the leaders involved in the creation of the Indian Constitution. The Constitution's meaning and relevance were also examined. A lively question-and-answer session centred on diverse historical viewpoints concluded the talk.

A guest lecture was organised in collaboration with Destination Heritage on the theme 'Environmental Sustainability through the lens of Ancient Wisdom' on March 23, 2023. The eminent speaker was Prof Sudha Gopinath, Retd Professor of Philosophy, Bangalore University and is currently serving as the Advisor at Destination Heritage. Dr Sudha



informed the students on the Vedic origins of Environmental Science. The highlight of the presentation was the spiritual undertone of her talk and the several examples she provided. Around hundred SJU students attended the lecture, which concluded with a very involved question and answer event that made it abundantly clear that the students found the session engaging and enlightening.

Workshops

Life Skills through Ancient Board Games

A workshop was conducted in collaboration with Destination Heritage on the theme 'Leadership skills through Ancient Board Games' on April 2, 2023. The resource person was Ms Immaculate Anthony, Founder of Ima Recreations.

The purpose of the workshop was to expose students to the world of classic Indian board games, many of which are threatened with extinction since many of the country's youth are unaware of the tremendous amount of enjoyment and social connection that can be achieved through the games. The workshop was attended by 25 students across different academic streams. The session highlighted the health and social benefits of old Indian sports, such ring catching for reflexes and Tiger and the Goat for teamwork.


Modern Methods and Tools for the study and conservation of Inscriptions



The workshop concluded with a closing address by Dr Shobha SV, Former Dean of the School of Chemical Sciences. The workshop proved to be relevant for the outgoing batch and was appreciated by students. INDUSTRIAL VISIT

The Department of Chemistry, in collaboration with Merck India, organised a one-day visit to the Merck Group at Jigani, Electronic City, Bengaluru on March 13, 2023, for II MSc Chemistry students. A total of 25 female students were accompanied by Dr Rita Pal, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry and Dr Suhas DP, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry. The Merck Group organized this event as a progressive initiative towards encouraging girls in science and technology.

Students were greeted by Ms Devika Krishnan, University Relations Coordinator, Merck India who gave them an overview of the site. They later had presentations by heads of various departments including Mr Shiv Kumar, Head of HR and Mr Rohit Kumar, Head of Oligo Synthesis and Production Lab. They also had a Q&A session with the leading ladies of Merck who shared the stories of their journey in the chemical industry.

After a brief interactive session, the students were given a tour of the industry. Led by Mr Ravi, they first visited the Oligo Lab where the synthesis of oligo by demethylation method, purification using

HPLC/electrophoresis, quality control (QC), packaging of oligonucleotides and various biochemical compounds and their operations were explained. They moved to the Analytical and Quality Control Labs, where they were briefed about procedures required for checking QC in instruments like HPLC-MS, LCMS, ICP and NMR spectroscopy. On their visit to the Recombinant DNA Technology Lab, they were able to see various tools and appliances used for the experiments. They then visited the R&D Labs where they saw detection and developmental apparatus labs that were being used for the production of chemicals, solutions, and so on.

After a break, they visited the Chemical Synthesis Lab where they were introduced to bioreactors involved in the manufacturing of chemical solutions. They also saw the storage, packaging, and delivery processes, and how protocols differ with the products. Finally, they visited the Waste Treatment Facility and were briefed about the steps to be taken to manage effluents from the facility.

The tour ended with a brief interaction with Mr Dhananjay Singh, Head of Science and Lab Solutions, Merck India and Mr Pankaj Joshi, Director of Commercial Marketing, Merck India.





DEPARTMENT OF BIOTECHNOLOGY



First year MSc Biotechnology students presented the research proposals they worked on as part of the Research Methodology and Scientific writing course, at a Research Symposium on February 11, 2023. The research proposals presented included Potential CRISPR-based alternatives to antibiotic treatment, early detection of pneumonia sepsis using miRNA by surface plasmon resonance, a pharmacogenomics approach for predicting drug resistance in Type 2 Diabetes mellitus, if FHR4 levels can be used as an early indicator of age-related macular degeneration, if the copy numbers of specific genes affect aging, and the effect of nanoplastics on mitochondrial dysfunction in brain cells.

Mr Nitish Dua and Ms Shivangi Verma from NCBS were the external examiners, and Ms Sunita Rajamani from the Department of Chemistry was the internal examiner.

Visit to InStem and TIGS

In conjunction with National Science Day & Rare Disease Day, an educational visit was organised for first-year MSc Biotechnology students and selected third-year BSc CBBT and CZBT students to InStem (The Institute for Stem Cell Science and Regenerative Medicine) on February 28, 2023. The visit comprised four talks by scientists from InStem and TIGS (Tata Institute for Genetics and Society), focusing on their organisations' aims and specific

research topics. The program also included laboratory tours and a visit to the Insectary and Type Collections facility. Dr Farha Ishtiaq, Principal Scientist at Tata Institute for Genetics and Society (TIGS) kick-started the visit by giving an introduction to National Science Day, and the significance thereof. Dr Bhagyashree Kuduskar gave an overview of rare genetic diseases with some facts: Rare Genetic Disorders plague 1 in 7000 people, with over 70 million patients in India alone. Dr Bhavana Muralidharan's talk opened with themes of research undertaken at InStem, with an introduction to the basics of stem cells and why their study can be important for clinical purposes. Professor Arvind Ramanathan



highlighted the truly massive machinery the human body is, with a chart highlighting the human metabolism with thousands of enzymes, substrates and metabolites. A lab visit to Dr Bhavana's lab was a valuable experience for students, as was the tour of the Insectary and Type Collections facilities.



The Department of Computer Science along with Technophite organised a seminar on “Metaverse and Guidance for Resume Creation” on October 18, 2022. Nearly 40 participants have gained knowledge on the topic and said it was enriching. Christopher Marshall was the resource person for this event which was organized by Dr A M Bojamma and Dr B G Prasanthi.

JWL Executive President Visit for Reviewing Existing Courses and Introducing New Courses

Fr Peter Balleis, SJ, Executive President of JWL, visited SJU for the third time to update the benefits of Certificate Courses offered by our university since September 2020.

Fr Balleis visited SJU on November 24 and 25 to discuss the inclusion of more courses and also to review the existing courses. The review aimed to update the current six-month courses to year-long courses. Officials from St Joseph's University attended the meeting to know the benefits of certificate course offered by various departments of SJU to regions across the world. Currently 24 countries and 62 learning centres across the world access the online courses. With the guidance and support of Frs Marcel, Pradeep

and Richard Rego, JWL online courses have been successfully offered since September 2020.

The Certificate courses offered by four departments – the Department of English, the Department of Commerce, the Institution of Communication and Media Studies and the Department of Computer Science – were briefly discussed and reviewed.

Pre-Placement Talk

A pre-placement talk was organised by AWS Academy, Department of Computer Science, for final-year computer science students. The guests were two industry professionals: Mr Abbas and Mr Himmath Husain. Mr Husain, who is a talent acquisition professional at Decision Minds, talked in length about the key factors and qualities that one should have to ace job interviews and the way in which one should prepare themselves for the same. He also talked about different aspects that an interviewer will look for in the resume of a fresher and how one can stand out as one. The session was interactive as he conducted mock interviews and gave students a sense of what is to be expected and how to groom ourselves to enter into the corporate world. It was such an enlightening session and has helped students prepare and gain confidence to do well in interviews and in securing a good job.

Workshop on Cross-Function Team (CFT-JWL)

On November 15, 2022, a workshop for 32 JWL

coordinators across 24 countries and 62 learner centres was conducted by Fr Peter Balleis, SJ.

The workshop emphasized the importance of updating the coordinators' roles and their contributions to make JWL grow further in reaching more students across the world. 


RETIRED STAFF


