seph's University, Dr (Fr) Victor Lobo SJ, Vice-Chancellor of St Joseph's University.



PARENTS' COUNCIL PARENT ORIENTATION PROGRAMME



The Parents' Council team at St Joseph's University organised a 3-day orientation program for the parents of students who joined various undergraduate and postgraduate courses this academic year. The program took place on July 14, 15 and 17 2023, with the objective of welcoming the parents of new students and familiarising them with the University.

The orientation on July 14 and 17 was for parents of UG students (Shift 1 and Shift 2) and July 15 was allotted for parents of the students of PG courses. The Parents Orientation programme for Shift 1 students kicked off with registration starting promptly at 7:30 am, efficiently organised by Dr Suhas and the team. Around 1300 parents attended the first day of orientation. The official event commenced at 9:30 am with Ms Tejaswini Balaji, the emcee, warmly welcoming the audience.

Ms Mamatha S, Coordinator of the Parent Council, introduced the council and its activities to the audience. The Vice-Chancellor Dr (Fr) Victor Lobo SJ addressed the gathering on the vital role parents play in educational institutions. He also mentioned the significance of parent support and involvement in shaping the children's educational journey. Following that, Ms Prathibha introduced the keynote speaker Dr Shailaja Shastri, Director of Research and School Mental Health

at 'Your Dost', Bengaluru—an organisation dedicated to promoting 'emotional wellness' for all. Over the past three decades, she has excelled as a teacher, trainer, researcher, counsellor, and an advocate for mental health and education. During her session with the parents Dr Shastri highlighted three key focal points for the parents in attendance. Firstly, she encouraged parents to view things from a different perspective as their children transition from a school environment to university life. Secondly, Dr Shailaja Shastri advised parents to adopt a management approach rather than trying to control every aspect of their children's lives. Lastly, she emphasised the significance of parental support when their child faces failure. The session proved to be enthralling, with active participation from many parents, and the speaker provided numerous real-life examples to illustrate her points effectively. The session was followed by an engaging Q&A session.

Upon reconvening, the functioning of the university system was explained by Ms Amita Priyadarshini. Following this, the Deans representing the various schools Dr Arul Mani, Dr V Christo Selvan, and Dr Beatrice, along with Mr Cyril the Deputy COE clarified the queries of the audience. After the discussion Fr Denzil Lobo SJ, gave a presentation on the rich history and future expansion

plans of the St Joseph's University. The day's events concluded at 12.30 pm with a vote of thanks by Dr Shari Tess, expressing gratitude to all participants and attendees. Lunch was provided to all the parents who attended the session.

Day 2: Orientation PG

The second day of the Parents Orientation program began with registration opening at 8:00 am, allowing participants to check in and settle in comfortably. At 9:00 am, the event officially commenced with a beautiful prayer and anthem performed by the university choir. Ms Sushmitha, the emcee for the day, warmly welcomed the audience to the program.

Dr Mohan Kumar introduced the chief guest of the day, and the dignitaries facilitated the keynote speaker, Dr Gururaja Kharjagi, the founder and Chairman of the Academy for Creative Teaching (ACT), Bengaluru, – a unique organisation dedicated to bringing about quality in education in general and teacher training in particular. Dr Kharjagi delivered an insightful session, urging parents to be attentive listeners to their children's joys and concerns. He also discussed the potential dangers of technology that might lead to students feeling disconnected from their parents and teachers. Following the thought-provoking speech, the session was opened to a question-and-answer segment, encouraging active engagement between the

speaker and the parents. After this, parents had a tea break to mingle and share their thoughts.

The post-tea break sessions featured presentations by Dr Denzil Lobo SJ, then presented the university's expansion plans, highlighting the institution's commitment to continuous improvement. Dr Tesmine Martin, shedding light on the university's functioning, and interaction with Deputy Controller of Examinations Mr Cyril, and the Deans of various schools. Dr Beatrice represented the School of Life Sciences, Dr Libi represented the School of Chemical Sciences, and Mr. Clement D'Souza represented the School of Humanities. These sessions aimed to provide parents with comprehensive insights into the university's academic structure and support systems. Parents actively interacted with the speakers during the Q&A sessions, addressing their concerns and seeking clarifications.

The event concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr Eraiah, expressing gratitude to all attendees, speakers, and organisers for their valuable contributions to the seminar's success. The active participation of around 1400 parents on the third day of orientation demonstrated their commitment to being actively involved in their children's education and the overall growth of the university community.

IGNITORS INTEGRAL FORMATION PROGRAMME



St Joseph's University has been organising this event for more than a decade. Following the motto,

Fide et Labore (Faith and Toil), SJU aims at integral formation - spiritual as well as secular. Ignitors believes in the idea that "To ignite your life, you must focus on one thing long enough for it to catch fire". This year's Ignitors' event kick-started with huge responses from the resource persons and the students alike. The resource persons, who are proficient in a variety of fields, were invited to share their insights and experiences.

Ignitors 2023 focused to ignite the lives of men and women for others by allowing them to focus on themselves. Since 2011, Ignitors has addressed more than 1,00,000 college students in Bangalore, Mangalore and other parts of Karnataka. During Ignitors, sessions/workshops on Personality Development, Leadership Training, Life-Skill Coaching, Social Analysis, Faith Formation (Retreat) and Value Education are conducted.

With no pandemic this year, the committee for Ignitors-2023, coordinated by Fr Maxim Dias SJ, Mr Ebenezer and Mr Salman planned and executed the programme well. Ignitors is an integral formation programme offered by the Karnataka Jesuit Educational Society (KJES) for the youth.

Ignitors visions to ignite the aspirations of students to think critically and creatively, to ignite passions in the hearts of young people for committed and constructive action. Ignitors aims to ignite the missions of the young spirits to dream dreams for the better world. The Ignitors 2023 has met the underlined motto, "A Fire that Kindles other Fires". The sessions have enhanced the students of St Joseph's University with an unique enhancement of their intellectual and moral facets of life. The active involvement

of various resource persons from diverse walks of life enhanced the quality of Ignitors this year and 9770 students attended the programme this year.

The sessions were organised for all the students of all the three shifts from September 20 to October 6 with 9770 student participants. There were around 70 resource persons who volunteered happily to be a part of this programme and took the sessions for the students. There were 6 sessions organised for each class throughout the two days with different life motivating topics by different resource persons. The team consisted of dynamic people from various arenas of expertise. The sessions were with a blend of Social Awareness and Analysis, and Soft Skills. The topics that were dealt in the sessions were: Conflict Management and Decision Making, Creative and Critical Thinking, Love and Infatuation, Stress Management and Self-care, and Career Guidance to cite

a few. Various activities held within the confinement of the class and outside the class gave a fun learning experience to the students this year. Ignitors 2023 aided the student in their integral formation of emotional, social and faith dimensions of life. This programme was intended to build a genuine democratic and secular society in India. The feedback received from the students was positive at a large scale and most of the students were happy about Ignitors. The students were kept engaged with activities and tasks, unlike typical classroom methods like the <chalk-talk> method. At the end of the first day, about 90% of the students rated the sessions very good, and good. One of the students who benefitted from the sessions commented: «The sessions were very insightful and I learnt about creativity, anger management and leadership.»

JESCOL II was conducted from July 10 to July 12, 2023. The sessions at JESCOL II were conducted by Dr (Fr) Joseph Lobo SJ, Dr (Fr) Joseph D'Mello SJ, Dr (Fr) Maxim Dias SJ, Dr (Fr) Alphonse Fernandes SJ.

The day on July 10 began with registration at the Ashirwad Centre, where faculty members from various Jesuit institutions gathered for training. The first session commenced with an inter-religious prayer, setting the program's tone. The morning focused on Jesuit leadership, with Father Lobo SJ discussing three dimensions of Jesuit learning. In the second part of the session, interiority and effective leadership were linked, emphasising Ignatian leadership. In the afternoon, Fr D'Mello SJ addressed six important aspects of Ignatian Ideals: Vision, Mission, Compassion, Passion, Introspection, and

Devotion. The session included activities where participants shared their interior thoughts within their groups and engaged in in-depth conversations.

The day on July 10 started with the registration to the programme at Ashirwad Centre where faculty from all the Jesuit institutions met. The first session for the day started with an inter-religious prayer. The first half of the day focussed on Jesuit leadership where Dr (Fr) Lobo SJ spoke about three dimensions of leadership that consists of the personal dimension that deals with one's interiority, institutional dimension dealing with leadership dynamics, and the wider world that deals with reaching out to the society. Followed by this, there was an activity conducted where three video clips were shown and participants were asked to reflect on their feelings. In the second part of the session, the idea of interiority and effective leader-

ship were connected and was further related to Ignatian leadership focussing on depth dimension.

On July 11, the day started with Dr (Fr) Lobo's session on «Shifting from Transactional to Transformational Leadership.» Ten essentials for developing as transformational leaders, emphasising a positive vision, belief in that vision, and having a genuine, passionate, and supportive network were discussed. In small groups, participants identified their leadership opportunities, assessed their current levels of leadership, and discussed the challenges of advancing to higher leadership levels. In the afternoon, Fr Joseph D'Mello discussed decision-making from an Ignatian perspective, covering various decision-making styles.

The third day of the JESCOL II on July 12 focussed on how as collaborators

we can reach out to the wider society. The day's session was conducted by Fr Maxim SJ and Fr Fernandes SJ. Participants were told about the functioning of the Society of Jesus and the works of justice undertaken by the Society of Jesus. Participants were asked to reflect upon the following questions-What are the challenges in the South Asian context? How do we respond and combat these challenges? How can we protect our pluralistic society? In the second half of the morning session Fr Alphonse Fernandes SJ spoke on social health.

In the afternoon session, participants in groups were asked to reflect on the following questions: What are non-negotia-

ble dimensions of Jesuit Institutions? What opportunities do we have to realise and implement the values? What are the major internal challenges that we face when we attempt to implement these values? The secretaries of all the five groups were asked to present their group ideas and was followed by the discussion amongst all of us.

ST JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL



The IQAC committee meeting was held on March 5, 2023. The data pertaining to the ranking of the college/ University for the NIRF, Indiatoday and The Week was presented to the members.

The feedback from the online mode of Open Elective courses was presented to the committee. The committee decided to implement the documentation activity in the department and decided that all departments would follow the template provided by the IQAC to document all the details.

The IQAC office completed the staff evaluation for the semester 2022-2023. The students completed the evaluation of all the staff members who had taught them for the semester. The deans have also completed the one-to-one evaluation with the staff members. For the School of ICMS, Dean Dr (Fr) Richard Rego SJ organised and completed the Staff Evaluation.

The evaluation of the Open Elective courses for the classroom sessions was also conducted at the start of the term. This is the first time hybrid modes of Open Elec-

tives have been conducted on campus. The overall feedback from these sessions has been good.

The IQAC office has been constantly improving the LMS system on the campus. Several meetings were held with the Linways team to integrate parameters into the system. An events and activities tab is included in the advanced profile to get uniform access to events conducted on the campus by all important offices. The ongoing-events report is also integrated into the website through this method.

Meetings with the criteria coordinators were organised regularly to obtain feedback on the important functionings of the university. A school-wise online meeting was conducted with all the staff members to update the process of accessing Linways and improving documentation at the department. Suggestions from the department have been recorded and discussed at the IQAC meeting.

A meeting was held with the documentation in charge of the departments on 17 August, 2023 to update the details of Linways systems for document uploads.

A delegation from Farook College, Kozhikode, Kerala visited the university to study the best practices. Dr Madappa M.B presented the overall approaches at the university. The team met the university officials and visited the facilities at the campus.

One of our mentee institutions from the UGC Paramash Scheme, St Joseph's Degree College, Hunsur, looking to get the NAAC accreditation, visited the campus to understand the functioning, preparation and documentation process. Dr Syed Wajeed, presented the team with suggestions and approaches. Dr Wajeed has been the mentor for the Paramash Scheme for this college. Dr Jyothi has been appointed as the

NAAC coordinator of the university. A meeting was held at the IQAC office to introduce the NAAC coordinator to the IQAC criteria coordinators. A time map has been suggested to work towards publishing a newsletter from the IQAC office.

Dr Madappa met with the counsellors of the University on 25 September, 2023 to discuss the data management of reports. The data for the term 2022-23 will be collected and presented to the management. The IQAC office has prepared the application file and applied for the awards under the Xavier Board of Higher Education in India in four categories: Best College, Best Researcher- Science, Networking and Academic Collaboration and Outreach and Extension.

Dr Madappa and Dr Syed Wajeed were the resource persons for the seminar on "Role of IQAC in Autonomous Status". The seminar was organised in Ramaiah College, Bengaluru. Dr Madappa spoke on the approaches in documentation maintenance of LMS that is necessary for a college to upgrade to autonomous status.

Dr Madappa was part of the Exam Reforms Committee constituted by the university. The team visited MAHE university and had several meetings with the stakeholders of the university.

Dr Madappa attended the workshop on "integration of NAAC standard with ISO

21001" on August 25, 2023, by ISDE Academy India. DrMadappa also attended the FDP on NAAC accreditation framework, by Guru Shree Shantivijai Jain College for women from 9 to 16 September. Dr Ronald Mascarenhas and Dr Madappa prepared the presentation for the KSHEC Inspection Committee visit to the university. Ms Swathi assisted the preparations.

The old AQAR submissions were reopened for error-check by the NAAC office. The documents of the last five years of AQAR were rechecked and submitted back to the portal. The IQAC office has initiated the process of documentation maintenance at the departments. Dr Madappa has been meeting with the heads of departments and presenting them with a format, file, and pen drive.

The process is ongoing and will be completed shortly. The IQAC office has initiated the collection of the student's progression for the year 2022-2023. The student progression will be completed shortly. The department of collegiate education data has been prepared and submitted to the collegiate office

The renovations of the IQAC office were completed and the office was inaugurated on August 18, 2023. Currently, the office is working on the All India University registrations.

OUTREACH

The BEMBALA programme, whose name is derived from the Kannada language, is dedicated to reaching and supporting the underprivileged and vulnerable segments of society. Its core focus is on creating avenues for education, awareness, and skill development. Participation in Bembala initiatives through rural exposure programmes fosters a learning environment for both students and faculty, contributing to the holistic growth of individuals. These activities play a pivotal role in shaping

They serve as foundational elements in the self-discipline of young adolescents, shaping their futures. lagers provides insight into the challenges faced in unorganized sectors.

Additionally, activities include raising awareness about the lives in elderly care facilities, extending support to the LGBTQ+ community, organizing eco marches, cleanliness drives, sapling plantations, village surveys, skits, weeding, wall paintings, group discussions, engagement with self-help group women, teaching at government schools, and volunteering in community service

Social Work Students' Field Work Orientation

In an effort to prepare the next generation of social workers, the Department of Social Work organized a comprehensive Field Work Orientation programme for the incoming I BSW and I MSW students. The event, held at Xavier Hall from July 20 - 21, 2023, welcomed a robust participation of more than 250 students.

The two-day programme, coordinated by Dr (Fr) G Augustine Lourdu, Dean, School of Social Work, and Dr Alan Godfrey A, Head of the Department, commenced at 9:00 am each day, providing an extensive coverage of crucial subjects.

This orientation program served as an invaluable initiation into the world of fieldwork activities, offering participants a profound insight into the department's rich history, the historical evolution of social work, and the pressing societal challenges they will encounter in their careers.

Goodness Painting at Sanrakshan Rainbow Home

I BSW students volunteered to paint and decorate the Sanrakshan Rainbow Home, an orphanage with the aim of providing a revitalized and welcoming space for the residents. The event took place on July 22, 2023, at Rajaji Nagar from 11 am to 2 pm, allowing students to interact with the children and create a positive environment. 10 participants, under the supervision of Josmy Joseph, painted the school and helped the marginalized students to learn in a better environment.



MSW Students Outreach Camp

Bembala Outreach Camp was conducted for II MSW students between July 24-28, 2023, under the supervision of Dr (Fr) G Augustine Lourdu, Dean, School of Social Work and Dr Prema Jyothi, Assistant Professor, School of Social Work. The camp commenced in Manvi, a remote location in Raichur, situated in the northern region of Karnataka. During the three-day endeavour, students fully embraced the rural environment. They engaged in a range of activities, including a plastic collection drive that yielded a substantial amount of plastic waste, primarily comprised of water pouches and tobacco wrappers. Additionally, students participated in activities like tree planting, offering tuition

classes, and contributing to wall painting projects. Some of the students took on teaching roles, providing valuable education to the village's school children. They also conducted a Social Analysis session with the school officials, addressing the specific challenges faced by the local community.

This village, characterized by a lack of basic necessities and limited awareness, presented an opportunity for the students to make a meaningful impact. Bembala Outreach Camp left students with real-world experience, enhanced empathy, and practical skills, equipping them to address societal challenges and make a positive impact in the field of social work.

Peace Meet for Manipur

In a powerful display of solidarity and concern for the ongoing violence in Manipur, the School of Social Work organized a peace meet at the entrance of the university's administrative block on July 25, 2023, at 12:55 pm. Dr Alan Godfrey, Head of the Department, School of Social Work, spearheaded the event in which 150 students from Manipur participated. The peace meets evolved into a passionate protest, attracting students, faculty, and concerned citizens alike. The participants united under a common goal: to demand swift action against violence, raise awareness of injustices in Manipur, and vehemently condemn the acts of terror that have plagued the region while advocating for human rights. Visually striking placards bearing messages such as «stop violence, initiate dialogue» effectively conveyed their heartfelt plea. Distinguished speakers at the event, including Dr Paul Newman, Fr Paul Lelen, and Alexander Zozanguel, shared harrowing accounts of the reality in Manipur, underscoring the urgent need for change.

Meeting at Freedom Park

On July 27, 2023, from 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm, the School of Social Work orchestrated a peace gathering at Freedom Park in Bangalore, with a resounding message of condemnation against the violence unfolding in Manipur. The event, under coordination of Dr Alan Godfrey A, Head of the Department, brought together approximately 20 participants. The students made striking placards and posters, which they displayed during the gathering. Rallying slogans underscored the importance of community engagement in tackling urgent social issues.

Participation in State Level Education Convention

On July 28, 2023, a state-level education convention, organized by the All India Save Education Committee (AISEC), was held at Gandhi Bhavan in the city.

Students from I MSW participated in this state-level convention that expressed its concern about the National Education Policy (NEP) posing a threat to equity and the quality of education. Dr HC Mahadevappa, Minister of the Social Welfare Department, Dr MC Sudhakar, Minister of Higher Education, and Mr Madhu Bangarappa, Minister of Primary & Secondary Education and Literacy, served as special guests for this event. Educational challenges, developing textbooks that promote scientific, secular, and democratic values, and tackling issues related to hostels and scholarships faced by SC, ST, and Backward Class students, were important topics discussed.

Tableau Display in Collaboration with Talaash

Talaash Association, an organization committed to supporting and advocating for the welfare of every child and woman, in collaboration with I MSW students, organized a compelling tableau display at the town hall in Bangalore. The programme was led by Seema Diwan, Founder President, and was held at 5:15 pm on August 3, 2023, with the participation of 30 students. Students portrayed various situations that victims of trafficking may have experienced. Through this programme, the students played a crucial role in educating communities about the tactics employed by traffickers to ensnare potential victims, empowering individuals to recognize and avoid risky situations.

Participation in Susumaya

On August 3, 2023, II BSW students, under the guidance of Ms Mariam Susumaya, embarked on a field trip to the YWCA in Kormangala. Their destination was the "Susumaya" project, an initiative aimed at ensuring that school-going children do not drop out. During their visit, the students were granted a unique platform to interact with these young learners, engage in games and activities, and learn from their experiences. This fieldwork experience served to bridge the gap between theory and practice for the budding social workers, equipping them with

a deeper understanding of the challenges and opportunities in the field.

National Seminar

A national seminar titled 'Religion and Society in India: Contemporary Multidisciplinary Exploration' was held from August 7-8, 2023 at National Biblical Catechetical & Liturgical Centre in Bangalore. The event was jointly organized by National Biblical Catechetical & Liturgical Centre, St Joseph's University, St Joseph's College of Commerce, Christ University, United Theological College, Christian Institute for the Study of Religion and Society, Kristu Jyothi College, St Peter's Pontifical Institute, and Dharmaram Vidya Kshetram. The event was conducted under the guidance of Dr (Fr) A John Baptist and was inaugurated by Dr (Bro) Arul M. This seminar served as a platform for scholars, students, faculty members, and professionals to share their research findings. Esteemed keynote speakers, including Mr Felix Wilfred, Ms Ruby Sain, Dr VD Swaminathan, and Dr YT Vinayara shared their insights and experiences.

Awareness Programme on Dementia

The event was organized by the School of Social Work in collaboration with the Nightingale Medical Trust on August 25, 2023. The session was conducted by Ms Sreejah, a distinguished faculty member from the Nightingale Medical Trust. The programme focused on dementia and its multifaceted aspects. 

Student seminar talk by Ms Sanjana Anand

Ms Sanjana Anand, a second-year PG Physics student at St Joseph's University, showcased her passion for Astrophysics during a captivating pres-

entation. She has immersed herself in the intriguing world of Radio-Loud Active Galactic Nuclei as part of her master's thesis at the renowned Indian Institute of Astrophysics in Bengaluru. The talk was conducted on August 31, 2023, in the AV Room, PG Block. Ms Sanjana's talk centred around the fascinating concept of Gravitational Lensing, a phenomenon influenced by the gravitational pull of celestial objects. She artfully elucidated the intricate relationship between gravity and the curvature of spacetime, leading to the lensing effect. Her presentation also explored the practical application of using the sun as a gravitational lens to enhance our understanding of planetary studies. Throughout the talk, she skillfully guided the audience through the lensing process, unravelling the mysteries of how massive objects in the cosmos can bend light and distort our perception of distant objects. The session concluded with an engaging Q&A session, during which attendees had the opportunity to delve further into the complexities of gravitational lensing.

Talk on Laboratory Astrochemistry by Dr Bhalamurugan Sivaraman

Dr Bhalamurugan, a professor at the Atomic and Optical Physics division in PRL Ahmedabad delivered a thought-provoking lecture on the intriguing field of astrochemistry, shedding light on the mysteries of the cosmos. His presentation began by exploring the concept of astrochemistry

and the universe's unyielding temperature, emphasising that it cannot dip any lower. He then transitioned to the vital role of water in the context of life, underscoring its significance as a fundamental element for the existence of living organisms. The talk happened on September 21, 2023, in the AV Room, PG Block. Astrochemistry, he elucidated, is gradually unravelling the enigma of life's origin in the universe. He went on to discuss the presence of frozen water on other planets, speculating that these icy reservoirs might harbour the building blocks of life. Highlighting the importance of atmospheres in sustaining life, Dr Bhalamurugan emphasised that in astrophysics, anything in a frozen state qualifies as ice. He said that certain planets, while seemingly inhospitable as a whole, might offer habitable niches. As an example, he cited the intriguing case of a cold crater on Mercury and the peculiar clouds of Venus. The presentation took a fascinating turn as Dr Bhalamurugan delved into the significance of shockwaves and their impacts on astrochemistry. He expounded on how innovative setups like the South African Large Telescope (SALT) are used to simulate planetary conditions and induce shockwaves to study their effects. He captivantly described how, through these experiments, researchers have observed the formation of amino acids from waste materials when subjected to shockwaves.


Open Day - Elixir

Guest Talk

On August 10, 2023, 'Symbiosis- A way to achieve Sustainability', An Invited talk was organised by the Department of Environmental Science, St Joseph's University, Bangalore. The Speaker was an alumnus of the department, Mr Siddharth Vinod, currently working as a Forest Programme Associate in African Bamboo, an Ethiopia-based Company. The talk was mainly focused on 'Sustainability and Agroforestry' and to understand the current situation of the Man-Environment relationship. Mr Vinod illustrated problems such as human-wildlife conflict, deforestation, population explosion, and loss of fertile land and elaborated on the concept of Symbiosis between humans and nature and how this Symbiosis is being greatly affected by human activities. He emphasised the concept of agroforestry as a strategy for sustainability towards both forest con-



servation and agricultural development. During the interaction, He clarified and answered all the queries that the listeners had in their mind. Moreover, the main objective of this talk was to understand the scope of sustainability and to understand the importance of sustainable development in the professional field to solve the ongoing problems in the current scenarios.

Inauguration of the Association 'Earthlings'

Mr DR Kumaraswamy, Chief Environmental Officer (Retd), Karnataka State Pollution Control Board, Government of Karnataka, inaugurated the Department association 'Earthlings' and on this occasion, he addressed the students of undergraduate and postgraduate studies on Environmental Science and Sustainability. Mr Kumaraswamy is currently working as the Director of the Prakruti Institute of Environmental Studies, Bangalore. The event happened

on August 12, 2023, at De Nobili Hall, Auditorium Block, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. The Speaker started his address with the concept of Sustainability and 17 Sustainable Development goals. He clearly explained the importance of these goals and how these 17 goals can impact a country's economic, social, and environmental development and also mentioned the obstacles to achieving these goals as the three main components economy, society, and environment are very much contradictory to each other. From an Economic perspective, he spoke about the potential of industrialization as one of the most considerable options for the fastest economic growth, adding to that he also illustrated one of the worst industrial disasters, the Bhopal Gas Tragedy, and its effect on the environment, humans, and wildlife till today. He explained the aspects of all the 17 SDGs, considering different components of the environment such as biodiversity, water, and air, and how India is heading towards it. He mentioned sustaining the use of fossil fuels and other non-renewable resources and illustrated the concept of Electric Vehicles. He concluded by mentioning the challenges that lie while implementing a policy that is focused on sustainability.

Talk on: Journey Towards Net Zero in Buildings

On August 19, 2023, a session was conducted on 'Journey towards Net Zero in Buildings' in De Nobili Hall, Auditorium Block, from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm. Ms Nandana Dilip Kumar, Executive General Manager, LEAD Consultancy and Engi-

neering Services (India) Pvt Ltd started the session by mentioning the climatic zones, efficiency in the use of resources, and increasing population, added to that she explained the unplanned urbanisation and its adverse effect on biodiversity and wildlife. From an Environmental perspective, she elaborated on the concept of Green Buildings, which is aligned with nine sustainable development goals. She briefly explained current trends in Green Building materials that include carbon-capturing materials, recycling and upcycling of products, low-carbon concrete alternatives, 3-D printing, smart glass, life cycle of the product, etc. This concept is more concerned with energy efficiency, Resource Conservation, Waste management, and providing a healthy indoor environment. She illustrated some of the initiatives such as the Indian Green Building Council and Energy Conservation Building Code (ECBC) which has been done by India to promote the concept of Green Building and in implementing this concept, India is leading in the worldwide scenario. The main objective of this concept is to implement the "Net Zero Energy Buildings" by selecting some very energy-efficient appliances and renewable resources of energy. At the end of the session, she shared her experiences and real-time

case studies motivating the students to understand the practical applications of the net zero concept in the current time. The session was attended by 85 students

Tree Walk

Department of Environmental Science, St Joseph's University, Bengaluru organised a Tree walk in Cubbon Park on August 26, 2023. The invited Experts were Ms Priya Venkatesh, Founder and Director, of The Naturalist School, Bengaluru, and Mr Karthikeyan S, Chief Naturalist Jungle Lodges & Resorts Bengaluru. The Tree walk started with the identification of trees. The students were divided into two groups. The experts briefly explained the process of identifying the tree and the parameters that influence the growth and rate of photosynthesis in the plant. The programme was very successful as it covered the identification of several different species of plants with common names, scientific names, and local (regional) names. Ms Priya explained how the leaf as an individual entity can be studied, with fruit structure, type identification, dispersal, and germination of seed. The Tree walk includes identification trees such as Bauhinia variegeta, Mahogani macrophylla, Pongamia pinata, Jacaranda Mimosifolia, etc. The study continued with the Carbon Sequestration and Quadrat method to

study tree abundance. The faculty members of the Environmental Science Department helped and briefly explained the procedure and importance of these two methods. For the carbon sequestration, more than 20 species were studied which showed the ability of each and every plant to estimate the amount of carbon sink that can take place in the locality. The Tree walk overall was a very productive activity. The experts were completely involved with the students and answered all the queries which thrilled and developed more curiosity for being with nature.

He gave a brief introduction about his company which is a biotechnology testing industry with a wide range of instruments such as NMR, HPLC, Analyzer, GCMS & LCMS. Their current area of research is microbiological analysis of food. The talk was continued by Mr Kaushik, a colleague of Mr Arvind.

He spoke about the different grants available for startups. Finally, the main speaker, Mr Arvind G concluded the speech by talking about the current opportunities available for internships at his company followed by a Q and A session where the students and faculty cleared up their doubts related to the future aspects.

Open Day - Elixir

The first-year students of the Department of Food Science and Technology took part in the 'Open Day – Elixir 2023' on September 30, 2023. The event started at 9:00 am wherein all the projects were set up at the UG science block. The first group presented a project on



'Natural pH Testing and Non-Newtonian Fluid(3FS-31)' where different raw materials were used in addition to reagents to observe a range of colour changes. In the case of non-Newtonian fluids, cornstarch, and water mixture was used to show that these fluids will change their viscosity when pressure or stress is applied. The second group presented on 'Chroma Tension (3FS-33)' where the objective was to demonstrate the property of surface tension and the effect that soap (a surfactant) has on the surface tension of milk. The third group presented on 'Microbial Spoilage of Fruits and Vegetables(3FS-34)' in which different media were inoculated with the microorganisms from the spoiled portion via serial dilution and then the plates were incubated for 48 hours at 37°C. Followed by which gram staining was done and observed under the microscope. The fourth group presented 'Edible Plastics(3FS-35)' where the main objective was to show the alternatives for plastics and the advantages of edible plastics in the food industry. The fifth group presented 'From palate to palette(3FS-37)' where the aim was to create five vibrant and eco-friendly watercolour paints using natural pigments extracted from readily available discarded organic materials and natural chemicals like alum and calcium carbonate.

World Coconut Day

The Department of Food Science and Technology in association with 'Food Miles' hosted its first event on Septem-

ber 2, 2023, at the PG block to celebrate World Coconut Day. This small event was conducted to spread the word on World Coconut Day. 




The Linguistic Society

Linguistics Society Inauguration

During the Mixer Week organised by the Department of English from July 24 to July 28, 2023, the Linguistics Society Inauguration took place on August 8. It introduced first-year students to some of the events and activities organised by the Linguistics Society such as Puzzle Tuesdays, Semantics, panels, the celebration of International Mother Lan-

guages Day, as well as promotion activities to raise funds. Following this introduction, audience members were invited to participate in 'Trigger Lee,' a speaking event where one is required to either defend or abolish the existence of a particular word. The participants had fun with topics like defending the use of the word 'cute' or abolishing the word 'rizz', and they took it in different directions. The event took place both during the lunch break at 1:00 pm as well as at 4:30 pm to ensure that students of all three shifts got the chance to be a part of it. The performances were judged by Ms Cynthia Nirmala Rajah, Assistant Professor, Department of English, and cat-themed coasters and bookmarks were given as prizes to the winners. Some of the student-produced merchandise like postcards and bookmarks were also on sale, which helped raise funds for the society.

The convenor of the Quiz Club, Pranav VS of II MA ENG, collaborated with the Linguistics Society to organise an etymology and cryptic clue quiz for the first weekly meeting of the association, known as Puzzle Tuesday. The etymologies of words like tamarind, apocalypse, berserk, and the phrase beat around the bush were some of the discoveries the participants made that day. Quite a few of them were new to cryptic clues so it was interesting to see their reactions when the answers were revealed and they realised how to solve them. Cryptic clues contain hidden anagrams and clues, and essentially cannot be read as a straight sentence but have to be parsed, that is, broken down. The quiz also featured a bonus question from Ms Cynthia which went as follows: Which apocalyptic word means 'bad star' referring to an ill-omened event based on the position of stars/planets? The second part of the word is also a flower and the answer to this question is disaster.

Meta Schools: Spelling Bee

As part of the sixth edition of Meta Schools, the Spelling Bee prelims commenced at

De Nobili Hall. The first round was written and students were divided into junior and senior categories. The preliminary round had three parts, which included spelling error identification and solving anagrams. The much-awaited finals of the Spelling Bee were conducted at 11:00 am by Shweta Philip from II MA ENG. The finalists, including Ramith G, Ragapriya G, Sunidhi S, Sukrit Sivaprasad, Unnati N, Dev Anoop, and Saanvi Patil, faced off in four intense and fun rounds that involved both writing and speaking. The first round was called 'Bugging' for the insect-themed questions that it consisted of. It turns out there is a moth named after Pablo Picasso because of its artistic blue, yellow, and red patterned wings, a beetle called Goliath because of its large size, and the Damselfly is named so because of its dainty and delicate appearance. The second round required the participants to come forward and spell words aloud. These words were of French origin and had everyone confused with their funny pronunciations. The third round was again a written one and was themed on clothing items, some of which, like the Leotard and the Jinnah cap are named after real-life people. The final round was a spelling round, this time with words of German origin.

Weekly Meeting: V2R1

V2R1, a new addition to the Linguistic Society's events, was first introduced to the students of St Joseph's University on August 22, 2023, at 1:00 pm in room A314. The event was hosted by Shweta and Senti, who provided a brief introduction to how it works. Approximately 21 people showed up which made the event lively. V2R1 is a team-based activity where participants are assigned a topic on the spot and are given two minutes to construct sentences using only one word each. It often results in funny sentences being created and a hearty laugh for all. Once the rules and guidelines were explained, everyone was eager to participate. A wide

range of topics, from 'telling your mom where you were last night' to 'informing your cat about a trip and your return,' were included. Many students took part and found themselves bursting into laughter at the sentences they created. Aadhya and Gopika, both second-year students, were given the topic of 'writing an email to a shampoo company to complain about their product,' and they crafted a narrative about a friend experiencing hair loss and their concerns. This event garnered many positive responses, and students eagerly anticipated the next occurrence of V2R1.

Metonym

Metonym 2023 saw a lineup of events organised by the Linguistics Society, which included Spelling Bee, V2R1, and Anaphora. Spelling Bee, which took place on September 29, had a preliminary round in written format. This round included three sections: spelling words correctly, kangaroo words, and solving anagrams. The Spelling Bee Finals took place in the CE Lab. Later that day, a new event called V2R1 was introduced at Metonym 2023. In this event, teams of two participants engaged in a narrative situation where each person spoke only one word at a time to complete sentences on various topics. Topics were provided on the spot, and participants had one minute to prepare and two minutes to perform. The performances ranged from explaining to their mother why they didn't come home the previous night to sharing embarrassing moments and comparing food items. The audience enjoyed the humorous and creative narratives. Anaphora was another new event introduced at Metonym and had a prelim round and a final round. The competition involved solving puzzles in Kingale, a fictional language, and other cryptic clues.

Weekly Meeting: Zine Making

On the occasion of Teachers' Day, the Linguistics Society held a short



zine-making session in A314 at 1:00 pm. During this session, students were taught how to fold and cut a zine and were also told a little bit about the different purposes zines serve. They were given a choice of three prompts: 'What's in Ma'am's/Sir's bag?', 'What fictional character is your teacher?' and 'Ingredients to make a good teacher.' They were provided art supplies such as stickers, sketch pens, glue, scissors, and colour paper. Each student spent around 20 minutes working on their zines, which could include text or visual elements such as drawings or pasted cut-outs. Their zines included wholesome caricatures of teachers, guesses as to what they bring for lunch, quotes from classes, and conversations with teachers that left an impression on them. A few students even made zines

for their school teachers. At the end of the session, each student had produced one zine. Some of the students exchanged zines to look at the different sorts of zines that can be made. A few students gave their teachers the zines as little tokens of appreciation for Teachers' Day.

Open Day: Puzzling Workshop

On September 30, 2023, the Department of English hosted Open Day where students from college, as well as guests from outside, were invited to take part in workshops and quizzes, and watch performances. The Linguistics Society organised a Puzzling Workshop which was designed and facilitated by Shweta Philip along with Ms Cynthia Nirmala Rajah, Assistant Professor, Department of English. This was a workshop that focused on how

to crack puzzles, particularly related to cryptic clues, which contained multiple meanings, homophones, and anagrams. For beginners and interested people, this workshop was particularly helpful as it made Linguistics and the world of words less intimidating, and more fun. There were three volunteers to help with this workshop and the society's merchandise was also on display right outside the hall as the workshop was being conducted. The event saw many people coming together, sometimes in teams of two, helping each other solve the clues that were given after each explanation on how to solve different types of puzzles. The workshop finally wound up with an activity. Coloured chits of paper were passed around with words written on them and the participants had to form their own cryptic clues based on what they had learned at the workshop. Some volunteered to even pose their cryptic clues to the audience. There were certificates given out to all the participants who attended this workshop.

Weekly Meeting: Puzzle Tuesday

On October 3, 2023, as a part of the Linguistics Society's weekly cyclic event, Puzzle Tuesday was hosted in A314 at 1:00 pm. Around 20 people enthusiastically showed up and started filling up the desks as the projector and cables were set up. This puzzle Tuesday mainly focused on cryptic clues and crossword puzzles. As the event began, the participants were given some rules and also explained how the whole event worked. Then a set of 13 cryptic clues were presented and similar to a general crossword, a clue and the number of letters the answer had were also displayed. Students paired up in teams and they were given twenty minutes to solve all the questions. As they shifted between solving clues and having lunch, most of them were excited when they found the right answer. Soon after the time was up, a quick correction was done by the office bearers present there. "I'm super excited

to find out the answers, especially to the sixth one," said one of the participants. The winners were awarded hand-made bookmarks made by students towards the end.

Documentation Screenings

As part of the weekly Tuesday meetings of the Linguistics Society, a screening was organised on October 10, 2023. The Linguistics students of II MA English have been working on documenting languages that are relatively less documented and researched in the mainstream. The first group that screened the video of their documentation effort looked at the language of Sindhi. They discussed how after the partition in 1947, the speakers of this language have been scattered into different geographical regions, and as a result, they hoped to observe some variations in the language spoken. The second group looked at the language Kokborok, which is spoken by most of the tribes in Tripura. They discussed how the language used to have a script which has since been lost. Later, it adopted the Bengali script and the Roman script, and the group hoped to observe the influences of other languages on Kokborok resulting from this. The methodology of research involved the narration of a popular local tale or story by different speakers of the language, and they each narrated it in the way they are familiar with it. This process showed variations in the dialects in terms of sounds, vocabulary, and word choices, as well as some minor variations in the plot. The students who had worked on the project shared observations and reflections on the same.

NOUS

Film matters and films that matter

The third edition of the Social Justice Film Festival, organised by the Department of English and Nous, screened a total of fourteen films curated by filmmaker RP Amudhan on October 6-7, 2023. The two-day festival aimed to deepen understanding of social justice issues and their portrayal in film through screenings and conversations. On the first day, the festi-

val screened seven films: The Leopard's Tribe, Our Film, Malipura Dam, Pehla Anda, Fantasy Parks, Awadagin Pratt: Black in America, and Lo Que Queda en El Camino. Each film and conversation shed light on different communities, their struggles, and accomplishments. The films followed the stories of people from Aarey to Tijuana, covering tribal rights, rural poverty, sex education, and racial discrimination. After the screening of Malipura Dam, there was a discussion with filmmaker Deepak Verma.

On the second day of the festival more films were screened: Yaan, The Unjust, and Beyond, Wanted 'Naxal' on Demand, Tam-Bram Cooking, Miles Away, Bonded, Fikirte, and Undocumented. The films explored a range of social issues that included distress migration, caste-based discrimination, police brutality, child marriage, and the disproportionate effects of natural calamities. The festival ended with an interaction with Mr Amudhan on the different ways of documenting struggles rooted in history and the significance of the filmmakers' relationships with those being filmed. A student from EFLU highlighted how lucky the attendees were to be at a film festival that boldly advocated for justice in today's political and academic climate.

Nous Showing - 1

Nous Showing is an event hosted by Nous, the co-curricular association for journalism and the news arts which aims to bring students together to build an appreciation for culture through the world of films. The event was inaugurated for the semester with the Audrey Hepburn series, dedicated to screening her films from various points of her career. The first screening was the 1953 romantic comedy film 'Roman Holiday', hosted on August 2, 2023, at 4:30 pm in the CE Lab. The event gathered about 25 students from different courses as well as faculty members who are Hepburn fans and share a passion for classic films. The emotions of the viewers were palpa-

ble as they enjoyed watching a young Hepburn fall in love and experience a renewed zest for life. They did not shy away from laughter as Hepburn rode a Vespa for the first time and nearly crashed into Roman bystanders. The audience gave a resounding applause for the film as the final credits rolled.

Nous Showing -2

Moviegoers came back to an Audrey Hepburn in a state of confusion for Nous Showing's second screening for the semester. 'Charade', the 1963 mystery film starring Hepburn and Cary Grant was screened as part of the Audrey Hepburn series, a month dedicated to Hepburn's films at various junctures of her career. Hosted with about 15 students in attendance, participants watched a more mature Hepburn, settled in her acting career, perform on screen. While she retained the grace and elegance that she is popularly known for even in 'Charade', her unfortunate embroilment with law enforcement agencies and subsequent fear for her life was noted by viewers, especially having watched her as a meek princess seeking a night of freedom in the 1953 romantic film 'Roman Holiday' for Nous Showing's first screening. The event was held on August 9, at 4:00 pm in the CE Lab.

Nous Showing - 3

After the Audrey Hepburn series of films, Nous Showing began a new set of screenings where Indian films were the focus. Its first screening was the 2021 Tamil film 'Mandela' starring Yogi Babu, marking the event's fourth screening for the semester. The event was hosted on August 23 at 4:30 pm in the CE Lab. The screening garnered attention among Yogi Babu fans as well as lovers of Indian cinema. Hosted with about 20 participants, they paid attention to how the usually comedic star portrayed an ostracised barber in a village ravaged by caste right before the local elections.

Many were able to draw parallels between the protagonist's experience of caste politics and election campaigning from real-life instances found in many parts of India. Many were also appreciative of how humour was used in the film to depict the stark realities of Indian society.

Quiet Debate

On September 27, 2023, Nous- the Association for Journalism and News Arts under the Department of English held its first Quiet Debate for the year on the topic 'What's your NEP like?' at De Nobili Hall at 4:30 p.m. The event provided a platform for students to express their experiences after the implementation of the National Education Policy. Students from Mount Carmel College, Jyoti Nivas College, and St Joseph's University joined the panel discussion that was moderated by Dr Arul Mani. Amrutha and Haniya from Jyoti Nivas College presented an in-depth review of the rigorous week which does not allow them to do anything outside of college, in addition to their struggles with the NEP. Srinidhi from Mount Carmel College found no time to pursue her passion for sports anymore, while Amrita, also from MCC, likened the whole experience to a horror film. Tanishk from St Joseph's University found a positive aspect in the NEP's insistence on learning the local language while Hridya from SJU gave a brilliant masterclass on what Open Electives and Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) under the NEP should be like as opposed to what they are. The discussion involving multiple institutions provided a forum for students to compare, relate, and analyse their individual and collective NEP experiences. The event was also live-streamed which provided the opportunity for students to view online.

Listening Post - 1

Listening Post hosted its first program for the semester with 'Keeping Company with Art', a session on 80s pop music with Dr Arul Mani. Dr Mani discussed some of the earliest times he was introduced to pop music

as he grew up in the 80s and discussed some of the songs that have marked watershed moments in pop culture. He talked about his life as a PU student in 1986 and noted the boom of pop culture with Lionel Richie's 'Hello'. He also discussed the impact of brands on pop culture and thereby their sales through Pepsi's popular 'new generation ad' featuring Michael Jackson. Prince's 'Purple Rain' and The Art Company's 'Susanna' were some of the other songs played, with the latter played in its entirety to the delight of the audience. As Dr Mani put it, "I had to make sure all of you listened to it and sat through the four minutes as I was once obsessed with the very song." The event was conducted with more than 60 participants on August 23 in A314 at 1:00 pm.

Listening Post - 2

The play revolves around an elderly couple, with the man fixated on meeting the king while the woman yearns for a story. The narrative takes a darkly comedic turn, addressing childhood trauma and delusion. It concludes with a surprising double suicide, prompting reflection on the complexities of a seemingly simple life.

Prof Taranne

It explores the theme of self-doubt. Accused of indecent exposure, the titular character attempts to prove his innocence using his supposed fame. However, his colleagues have no recollection of him, and his sister unveils the truth, leaving many unresolved questions. The play's charismatic lead and audience engagement are highlights, but the lack of a clear ending leaves a sense of ambiguity.

The tale explores an unnamed writer's fascination with Indrajit Ray, a man from Calcutta, and his seemingly peculiar life. As representatives of the Department of History, four II BA students got the privilege of attending a 15-day workshop centred around the preservation and digitisation of Bengaluru's historic inscriptions. Hosted by the esteemed Mythic Society, an institution dedicated to Indic Studies in Bengaluru. The workshop took place from June 26 to July 8, 2023, from 10:00 am to 4:30 pm. The students' main task was to use 3D image scanning to digitally conserve inscriptions dating back to the 8th to 19th centuries. The objective of this project is to make this valuable history accessible to the public. During the workshop, students gained hands-on experience working with digital 3D models of the inscriptions. They painstakingly identified and labelled each alphabet of the old Kannada script, then archived the information. Additionally, they gave presentations highlighting the inscriptions' historical significance and the valuable insights they offer. The archived cuttings will be utilised in the Mythic Society's forthcoming open-source online database, allowing anyone to trace the evolution of the Kannada script from as early as 750 CE to the present day.

Jashn-e-Itihas – Celebrating History

The Department of History and Parishodhana, the History association hosted an outstanding series of events from August 4 to August 14, 2023, from 1:00 pm to 2:00 pm, in honour of India's 76th Independence Day on August 15, 2023. This one-week commemoration included a diverse range of innovative and engaging activities, including Digital Art, Story Writing, Debate, and Quiz competitions. The 'History in 60 seconds' street play was a standout highlight. The series culminated on August 14, 2023, with a grand cultural program that showcased India's rich heritage. DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

Field Visit to St Martha's Hospital

Under the guidance of Dr Maria A, Co-ordinator, Department of Sociology, the Final Year Sociology students had the privilege of participating in a field visit to St Martha's Hospital in Bangalore as part of their vocational paper 'Social Intervention in Healthcare and Hospital Management'. This experience provided an opportunity to engage with the real-world dynamics of medical sociology by immersing ourselves in the hospital's administrative operations. The students were assigned to the administrative block. Here, they witnessed the front-line activities that play a crucial role in the patient experience. The administrative staff managed tasks such as providing tokens, confirming appointments with doctors, and handling billing procedures. The students observed how efficient coordination and effective communication were vital in ensuring the smooth flow of patients through the hospital. The students were given the opportunity to assist in filling out forms for first-time visitors to the hospital. Through conversations, they learned about the backgrounds of the patients, their medical histories, and their reasons for seeking medical care. This exercise highlighted the social and economic diversity among patients and their varied experiences within the healthcare system. Interacting with patients during

the form-filling process exposed the students to a diverse range of backgrounds, cultures, and socio-economic statuses. The field visit to St Martha's Hospital was a transformative experience that allowed students to apply theoretical concepts from our sociology studies to a real-world setting. The students were reminded of the critical role that sociological understanding plays in addressing healthcare disparities and fostering patient-centred care.

Meraki

Meraki was a series of events organised by the Department of Sociology under the guidance of Dr Maria A, Co-ordinator, Department of Sociology, to provide students with an opportunity to relieve their stress and improve their collaborative skills. The theme of the event derived its inspiration from the Greek word 'Meraki', which means to do something with soul, creativity, or love; to put something of yourself into your work. The first club meeting was held on August 12, 2023, and involved 60-70 student participants from the final year Sociology students and 12 student leaders. All the events followed the same schedule and started off with a small introductory talk by Jeffrey Samuel, student leader, on the meaning and purpose of the events. Jeffrey gave a talk on 'Empathy and Self-Esteem' in every session which was well received by all the student participants. The participants were cooperative and supportive in all events. Meraki was an enriching experience for everyone as they were able to connect with each other through the games and improve their mental and social well-being.



Confession Booth

The Confession Booth Event was held at the Arrupe Atrium on August 23, 2023, and started at 11:00 am with the students of the university writing the confessions and placing them in the confession box prepared. Many students expressed that the act of writing a confession helped them feel relaxed and relieved. The main purpose of the event was to apply the findings of sociological theories on human interactional behaviour. Confession is closely related to the sociological theory known as 'Symbolic Interactionism.' This theory was developed by scholars such as George Herbert Mead and Herbert Blumer and focuses on how individuals create and interpret meaning through social interactions, symbols, and shared understandings. Symbolic interactionism helps us understand how confession operates as a dynamic social process, where meanings are constructed, negotiated, and shared through interactions, symbols, and shared cultural frameworks. The event was successful in achieving its objectives and over 300 students participated in it, all of whom expressed that the event made their day better.

Guest Lecture: Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar's Idea of Democracy in India

Dr Zeeshan Husain, Independent Researcher and Sociologist, delivered an engaging and insightful lecture that traversed the life and ideas of Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar. He emphasised Dr Ambedkar's profound belief that economic and social democracy are the bedrock upon which political democracy must stand. Guest Lecture: Water and Waste Management in the City of Bangalore

Dr Chandini Bhambhani, Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology (Shift 3), organised a guest lecture on August 31, 2023, in the AV Room, Arrupe Block, from 5:00 pm to 6:30 pm Dr Renukumar, Additional Chief Engineer, BWSSB, was invited to enlighten Journalism-Sociology students as a part of their core paper on Urban Sociology. Dr Renukumar's presentation on Bangalore's escalating water demands shed light on a pressing issue faced by the city's burgeoning population. With expanding city limits and a surge in urbanisation, the strain on the Bangalore Water Supply and Sewerage Board (BWSSB) to provide adequate water coverage has intensified. The speaker astutely identified alternate water sources as a crucial strategy to meet future demands, emphasising the pivotal role of Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) in recycling and reusing wastewater, a sustainable approach that's gaining traction. Furthermore, the presentation underscored the



significance of collaborative efforts involving various stakeholders, including BWSSB, civil society organisations, NGOs, Resident Welfare Associations (RWAs), and individual citizens, to ensure equitable access to water. This inclusive approach recognizes that addressing the water challenge in Bangalore requires collective commitment and innovative solutions. The guest speaker's engaging session drew to a close with a dynamic exchange of ideas. Students displayed a keen interest in the topic of water, and their questions spanned a wide spectrum. The diversity of questions demonstrated not only the students' engagement with the topic but also their recognition of the broader implications of water-related issues, making it a thought-provoking and insightful conclusion to the session. The talk was attended by 56 students.

Potpourri

The Potpourri Event was organised under the guidance of Dr Maria A, Coordinator, Department of Sociology, in A015, Arrupe Block, at 1:00 pm on September 1, 2023. The event was a mixture of three rounds: the first round was riddles, the second round was dumb charades and the third round was pictography. All the events were based on the theme 'Marginalisation'. The teams were given riddles to solve with a time duration of 10 minutes. The participants were put through a rollercoaster of riddles based on the theme. The teams who solved the riddles correctly and on a timely basis proceeded to the next round. In the second round, there were four rounds of three minutes each along with a bonus round being conducted as the teams had come to a draw. The participants were put together as four members in 2 teams in which they were given a word related to the theme which they then had to depict using actions. Special Lecture- Politics and Conflict of Outer Space in the 21st Century

On June 28, 2023, a special lecture was organised by Aspire, the student association of the Department of International Relations, Peace, and Public Policy, from 9:30 am to 11:00 am. This lecture marked the first event organised by the association for the new academic year 2023-2024, as it heartily welcomed all the first-year students from the department. The special lecture on the topic of 'Politics and Conflict of Outer Space in the 21st Century' was given by the esteemed speaker Ms Harini Madhusudan, Teaching Assistant, Department of International Relations, Peace and Public Policy. The lecture was indeed engaging and informative as she explained the geography of space, the existing treaties governing space politics, and their loopholes. In her elaborate discussion, she also emphasised the continuing space race delving deeper into the controversial aspects surrounding weaponization, militarization, and commercialization of outer space. Overall, the event successfully broadened students' perspectives, providing them with valuable insights and details regarding the ongoing space politics. It was attended by 75 students.

Special Lecture- Myanmar's Troubled History: Failed Democracy, Ethnic Conflict and Violence

On August 11, 2023, a special lecture was organised by Aspire, the student association of the Department of International Relations, Peace, and Public Policy. The event commenced at 9:30 am in De Nobili Hall, Auditorium Block, with a moment of silent reflection, followed by a warm welcome message. The esteemed speaker for the event was Ms Aparupa Bhattacharjee, renowned for her research focused on Southeast Asia, particularly Myanmar, Thailand, and Malaysia. Her expertise lies in politics, conflicts, and peace processes related to Myanmar with a specific emphasis on the Rohingya conflict. She has played an active role in the outreach teams of IPCS and the National Institute of Advanced Studies and has affiliations with the Consortium for South Asian Think Tank (COSATT) Network. Ms Bhattacharjee explored Myanmar's past in the lecture, especially the era of British colonial rule (1886–1948) when the country was referred to as Burma. She further presented the religious and ethnic breakdown of the country with 87 percent of the population being Buddhist, followed by 6.2 percent being Christians. The Hindus and the Muslims represent the minority in Myanmar. Later in the lecture, the speaker emphasised the significance of the symbols and emblems utilised in socio-political contexts.

The speaker repetitively focused on the religious and ethnic divide prevailing within the country since its dynastic period. The event then culminated in a Q&A session, followed by appreciation and gratitude towards Ms Bhattacharjee. She was presented with a token of appreciation for her valuable insights into the complex history of Myanmar. 75 students attended the lecture


Reorientating the Teaching-Learning Paradigm for the Twenty-first Century Classroom

About 100 Faculty members and teachers from different universities, colleges, and schools all over India attended the workshop. Dr Susan Mary Philip, Assistant Professor, Department of Biotechnology, St Joseph's University, Ms Rachel Stone, Senior Lecturer, Sheffield-Hallam University, UK, and Dr Jennifer Loertscher, Professor of Biochemistry at Seattle University, Washington, USA, were the speakers. On July 5, the workshop commenced at 8:30 pm and Dr Sandra Misquith, Head of the Department of Biochemistry, gave the welcome address. Dr Daniel Andrew M Gideon, Assistant Professor, Department of Biochemistry, began with a word of prayer. Dr Sandra introduced Dr Susan, who delivered her talk titled 'Enabling enquiry and self-learning in the classroom.' On July 6, Dr Shraddha Namannavar, Assistant Professor, Department of Biochemistry, opened the meeting with prayer at 8:30 pm and introduced Ms Rachel Stone, who delivered her talk titled 'Supporting student-centric learning.' Dr Sandra offered a prayer on July 7, and Dr Daniel introduced Dr Jennifer, who delivered her talk, 'Connecting research with purpose: Strategies to support whole person education.' Dr Daniel summed up the entire workshop by offering a brief reflection of all three talks and the session closed with a vote of thanks by Dr Sandra.

Elixir

St Joseph's University organised Elixir on September 30, 2023, for Open Day. 27 students from the Department of Biochemistry participated by presenting five different models in room S308, Science Block. The first model, presented by students of I BCZ, was on the mechanism of enzyme action. Models two and three, by the second-year students of Biochemistry-Microbiology were based on ABC transporters, and biochemical mechanisms of anti-TB

drug resistance respectively. The fourth model explored insulin structure and its industrial production, presented by students from III BBZ. The fifth model on bioluminescence was presented by second-year Biochemistry-Botany students. These models were presented to the judges and were open for students and faculty members of other departments from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Faculty members also played a promotional video in the classroom to emphasise on the UG programme of our department and highlight some memories of events to the audience.



Investiture Ceremony and Expert Talk on Genome Editing

Organised by the Biochemical Society (with Dr Sandra Misquith, Head of the Department of Biochemistry as the faculty in-charge), this meeting had a two-pronged agenda. Firstly, an expert talk on genome editing by Dr DN Rao, Former Professor, Department of Biochemistry, Indian Institute of Science, and incumbent President of the Biochemical Society of India. This was followed by the investiture ceremony to formally entrust the new office bearers of the Biochemical Society, for the academic year 2023-24, with their designated roles and responsibilities. Held in De Nobili Hall, Auditorium Block, on August 2, 2023, at 12:45 pm with an audience of 100, the event commenced with prayer and a reading from the Holy Bible. Dr Sandra introduced Dr Rao who then shared his insights into the ideas of Jennifer Doudna and Emmanuelle Charpentier, who shared half the Nobel Prize in Chemistry for their fundamental discoveries into how genome editing works using the CRISPR-Cas9 system, which defends bacteria from viral pathogens. By exploiting this system for editing genomes, it is possible to delete or introduce DNA sequences into any genome of interest. This modern technological discovery has ushered in new prospects for solving many genetic diseases and opened new avenues to study genetics further. After the talk, Dr Melwin Colaço, Registrar, confirmed the office bearers of Biochemical Society and conferred them with badges.

Journal Club Meeting: Bee Vaccines and Unveiling Paracetamol

Bee Vaccines and Unveiling Paracetamol was the topic of discussion for a meeting of the journal club wing of the Biochemical Society, held in S303, Science Block, on August 12, 2023, at 12:45 pm. The meeting was open to all students, and had 140 participants. The discussion explored how bee vaccines aim to improve bee immunity against bacterial pathogens which causes foul-



brood disease, a highly contagious bacterial disease that reduces larvae to brown goo. A killed version of the pathogenic bacteria (the etiological agent of foul-brood disease) is injected into the “royal jelly” which the worker bees feed to the queen. The queen bee then deposits the vaccine in her ovary and confers immunity against pathogens to her progeny. Super foods were also discussed where students explored food fads related to the hype around super foods in social media. Many super foods are being consumed indiscriminately without scientific grounding. Since the speaker who had prepared to talk about paracetamol did not turn up, the topic was cancelled. The participants received e-certificates for attending the session.

Expert Talk on Immunology of T-cell Development

The Biochemical Society organised an expert talk on Immunology of T-cell Development, under the Department of Biochemistry at Loyola Hall, Auditorium Block on October 3, 2023, at 12:45 pm. The speaker, Dr Kushagra Bansal, highlighted the key processes involved in T-cell (Thymus cell) development. T-cells are involved in cell-mediated immunity. They mature in the thymus, the primary lymphoid organ, located above the heart. T-cells undergo positive selection and cells with higher affinity against our own body's self antigens are destroyed while cells with lower affinity towards self-antigens are allowed to survive and mature. The mTEC (medullary thymic epithelial cells) possessing the Aire (autoimmune regulated) gene was found responsible for the gene expression

of a plethora of self-antigens, counted to be as high as 766 using the outdated method of DNA microarray and 7621 genes using the more sensitive method of RNAseq. Dr Bansal shared about the interaction of Aire gene with topoisomerase-I, an enzyme involved in DNA topology. Deletion of topoisomerase-1 in an experiment led to development of mice lacking the thymus gland in his laboratory and this is being explored in animals and the therapeutic implications of this are important in advancing research in thymus gland development and autoimmunity. The talk was received with great enthusiasm by faculty members and students of the Biotechnology, Microbiology and Biochemistry departments.

RSC ChemCareers India 2023


Talk on 'Large Scale Synthesis of Densely Functionalised Pyrrolidone'

TSC OT Selection

On June 13, 2023, 13 (8 SDs & 5 SWs) from 1 KAR ARMD SQN NCC TP-3 took part in the Obstacle Training (OT) competition at the Battalion Level of Thal Sainik Camp selections. The competition was conducted at Christ University, Kengeri. Cadets reported to the venue at 8:00 am in tracks and sports shoes. This competition was conducted under the aegis of eight Karnataka BN NCC, Bangalore 'B' Group. This was the third round of selections for the selected 40 aspirants, who qualified for the physical and written tests. The interview was conducted from July 24 - 26. It used to begin at 9:00 am. The panellists involved alumni and second-year and third-year cadets. PIQ forms, personality, and basic knowledge requirements of each aspirant were validated throughout. Each aspirant was given a serial number and was called in on their turn by the cadets. Selection of aspirants for the final round of selection, that is the medical test, took place under the guidance and supervision of the alumni and Third Year cadets.

Medical Test of Batch 2023-26

On August 3, 2023, 17 cadets (11 SDs & 6 SWs) of 1 KAR ARMD SQN NCC TP-3 GP-B conducted the final round of medical tests on the aspirants. ANO, Capt Akshay D Mandlik along with the PI Staff supervised and directed this final round.

The medical test began at 12:55 pm and concluded at 1:55 pm. All cadets were present in their combat. This test was a culmination of weight & height checks, knocked knees, sweaty palms, flat foot, eye test, and Carrying Handle. Meanwhile, a few of the opening cadets were manoeuvring their interview rounds with the ANO. A set of 26 aspirants were selected thereafter, proceeding into their probation period.

Army Attachment Camp, MEG & Centre

On August 8, 2023, 11 cadets (11 SDs) from 1 KAR ARMD SQN NCC TP-3 represented the squadron and St Joseph's University at the Army Attachment Camp in MEG (Madras Engineer Group) and Centre, Bengaluru. The camp spanned 12 days from August 8, 2023, to August 20, 2023. Starting with the orientation and the inaugural day the schedule started with a 5:45 am roll call, followed by a campus run and physical training in tracksuits. Breakfast at 7:30 am was succeeded by drill sessions in A1 uniform, led by Madras regiment drill instructors. Theory classes and visits to historic venues filled the day until 4:00 pm, with an hour for lunch. Sports competitions followed, and recreational activities continued until 7:30 pm. The day ended with a roll call, dinner at

8:00 pm, and lights out by 10:30 pm. The camp had 2 holidays, a Sunday and Independence Day, and a tree plantation drive was conducted. During the theory classes, we were taken on visits to various stations of engineering at the MEG and centre. Theory classes also covered a lot of informative topics. There were seminars taken by members of the army education corps like a brief seminar on ways to join the defence forces and a few concepts of map reading. The camp concluded with a cultural exchange between groups of the KAR GOA directorate that attended the camp. The camp was attended by 260 cadets across the KAR & GOA directorate with 3 ANOs and PI staff.



First Official Parade

On September 11, 2023, 26 (14 SDs & 12 SWs) of 1 KAR ARMD SQN NCC TP-3 GP-B initiated the first official parade for the year 2023-26. All cadets sported A1 uniforms while the probies donned tracksuits along with sports shoes. All cadets appeared in their A1 uniforms while guards, pilots, and appointees appeared in ceremonials and first-year cadets in formals. 5 SWs from 1 KAR ARMD along with 5 cadets from 1 KAR AIR comprised the Guard team while two cadets from 1 KAR ARMD piloted the chief guests. Blood Donation Drive

On August 25, 2023, 21 (10 SWs & 11 SDs) from 1 KAR ARMD SQN NCC TP-3 GP-B organised a Blood Donation camp in association with five National Service Scheme units of the university, Red Cross Karnataka and Lions Club International, Bengaluru. Campsites involved were the auditorium basement and Xavier Hall of the PG Block. Donors included our institution's students above 18 years of age. First-year cadets appeared in formals while second-year cadets manoeuvred throughout the event in their combat. The event commenced at 6:30 am and ended at 8:00 pm. Two ambulances with the necessary medical prerequisites were there. Each donor was eligible to donate only 350ml of their blood. This event embarked on the first official social service activity of this academic year for the newly recruited NCC cadets (2023-26). National Sports Day



NSS UNIT - 2

Ten volunteers from NSS Unit 2 took part. All selected volunteers from all units of NSS gathered by 8:45 am at the Arrupe Atrium. Instructions were given to volunteers by 9:05 am and they took their respective positions. Some were at the registration desks set up at the entrance to Arrupe Block. HR counselling booths were placed on the ground floor of New Block, to help applicants select the best option. Other volunteers were assigned to provide refreshments to the senior citizens. There were even volunteers in the lift. A feedback booth was also set up to give feedback and register any issues faced. The registrations began around 9:50 am and went on till 3:00 pm. Around 530 senior citizens showed up for the event. They were interviewed and selected applicants were offered jobs including tele-calling, reception, consulting, supervisory, administration etc, offered by more than 35 companies. Physically fit people from the age of 55-70 years could attend, with a preference for the non-pensioned. Lunch was provided to everyone at 12:30 pm. The event went on till 4:20 pm. After ensuring the departure of all applicants, the volunteers left by 5:00 pm.



Volunteer Selections

On August 24, 2023, volunteer selections for Unit 2 were held at the Auditorium Basement from 2:00 pm to 4:10 pm. Volunteers were selected through the interview process. Mr Sathyanarayan R, Asst Programme Officer, Unit 2, and Mr Clifford Noel, Member, Unit 2, were the interviewers. 112 interviewees came forward to be part of the Unit. The main criterion for volunteers was dedication and willingness to serve society. Previous years of experience in NSS or any other organisations offering social service was appreciated. Blood Donation Camp


