Two-Wheeler Parking For Even Semester 2023-2024

All the UG and PG students who have not registered for parking in the odd semester are hereby informed to register for the two-wheeler parking for the even semester 2023-2024 in the Linways student portal under 'Application Form' (next to your Photograph). The following instructions are to be followed strictly:

- 1. All the students who wish to park their two-wheelers on campus must register for the parking and collect their parking pass from the Admin Office Counter No. 3.
- 2. Students who register for parking need to have the following documents:
- Registration Certificate
- Driving License/Learner's Licence
- Insurance Certificate
- Pollution Under Control (PUC) Certificate either in hard copy or in DigiLocker
- 3. Students with electric vehicles without registration certificates need to contact the IT cell to manually register their vehicles. No charging points will be provided in the campus.
- 4. The vehicle registration fee will be Rs 1500/- and will be valid for the end of the semester.
- 5. The registration link will be active from 2nd January 2024 to 7th January 2024.
- 6. All the students can collect their vehicle passes from 8 January 2024 between 2:00 pm to 3:00 pm.
- 7. Only the registered vehicle shall be allowed inside the campus with a valid pass.
- 8. Students are required to lock their helmets. The University will not be responsible for any property lost.
- 9. Students are not allowed to park their vehicles around the campus or in the neighbourhood to avoid disturbing the residents. The University will not be responsible for students' vehicles illegally parked around the campus or in the neighbourhood.

NOTE: Any violation of the said norms will lead to the cancellation of his/her parking pass and he/she will be debarred from bringing any vehicle to the campus during the rest of his/her studies in the University.



Rules and Regulations

The University provides parking space on the campus to its students commuting to the University in their own vehicles. To reduce congestion on the campus and keep the campus safe from COVID-19, having pick-up and drop on campus is strictly prohibited. However, pick-up and drop on campus is permitted for students with Special Needs. The use of the University premises for parking, and pick-up and drop facilities are subject to the following rules:

1. Two-Wheeler Parking

- 1. Parking for two-wheeler vehicles is provided to students with Parking Pass only.
- 2. Wearing proper helmets is mandatory for both riders and pillion riders.
- 3. Four-Wheeler Parking is not allowed for students.

2. General Instructions

- a. Vehicles can be parked on campus only from 7.00 am to 4.00 pm for the students of shifts 1 and 2, and from 4:00 pm to 9:00 pm for shift 3 students on all working days.
- b. Two-wheeler vehicles of the students need to have the following documents:
- a) Registration Certificate
- b) Driving License
- c) Insurance Certificate
- d) Pollution Under Control (PUC) Certificate either in hard copy or in DigiLocker.

3. Penalties for Violation of Rules

a. Violation of the driving or parking rules within the campus will attract a fine of up to Rs 1000+GST per violation.

4. Instructions in View of COVID-19

a. All safety guidelines issued by the Government of India and Karnataka, the BBMP, the Institution and the Departments concerned with COVID-19 should be followed strictly while driving/parking inside the campus and on and off campus.

The University is committed to preserving the environment and reducing its carbon footprint. Accordingly, the students are encouraged to contribute through measures such as vehicle pooling, using public transport, use of electric vehicles etc. The University does not have a provision to charge electric vehicles on campus.
