## GENERAL HIGHLIGHTS:

- As per State Government Notification, the following three Associate Professors of the University were promoted to the level of Professors: Pro-Vice-Chancellor Prof. Ronald Mascarenhas, Dept of Chemistry, Registrar Prof. Melwin Colaço, Dept of Chemistry and Prof. Jayaram Reddy, Dept of Botany.
- The University houses a digitally enabled world-class library which is radio-tagged and friendly for a physically challenged.
- Digital evaluation is done for all the end semester exams. This has reduced errors and has been smoothly implemented. Examination centre is completely computerized. Barcode system is there at all levels and results are declared by specific days of completion of the exam. Digital attendance with biometrics and scan at exams is implemented this semester for the PG students.
- Totally 362 research papers have been published from 2022.
- The university has produced 50 SCI indexed publications and 140 ISBN publications.
- A Total of 52 books and 101 book chapters have been published in the last two years.
- There are 29 patents obtained by the staff of the university.
- A total of 412 Teaching staff and 149 Non-teaching staff-149 are working in the university with an increase of more than 100 staff.
- 42 of our UG IFA students have cleared the ACCA exams (Association of Chartered Certified Accountants, UK). The department has achieved the maximum number of students securing in the list of top ten ranks for India.
- University has received a total of Rs. 16,20,130 from private, government and other benefactors for Students scholarship in AY 2022-23. The University has spent Rs. 1,99,25,574 in Students scholarship in AY 2022-23. 957 students have been befitted under the scheme.
- An online class from Infosys Springboard, which is a Digital literacy program launched as part of the Infosys ESG Tech for Good charter. It aims to enable students and associated communities from early education to lifelong learners by imparting digital and life skills through curated content & interventions, free of cost for our students. All Ug students have to take up this course.
- A new placement office and office for international student affairs is set up at the university.
- In-house publications -An In- House periodical "Josephite" is published by the university to cover all events of the campus and daily events are covered by the newsletter "The Beacon". Many departments have in-house newsletters and up to 15 In-house publications such as Open Dosa, Perpendicular, Outreach , Helixer and Zest are brought out each year.
- Orientation programme for Parents –The innovative programme initiated to foster parents –ward –university relationship Orientation for the parents and guardians is conducted in the beginning of the academic year. The programme is compulsory and the attendance has been 95%.



- Vice-chancellor Dr Victor Lobo SJ attended the COP28 in Dubai. He attended the climate leadership and societal impact conference.
- Elixir 2023-24, an open day event by all departments was organised by the University. Students from various schools were invited for the programme.

## INFRASTRUCTURE:

- The 4 floor of the science block was expanded to house new laboratories, staff rooms, research laboratories, cabinets for PhD students and counseling rooms.
- A Sky walk connecting the Undergraduate and postgraduate block across the Langford road is fully operational. The initiative was completed with the support from BBMP, MLA and Alumni.
- Many staff rooms have been renovated. New staff rooms have been constructed to seat the third shift teaching faculty and other departments which had an increase in the faculty number
- New offices have been created for Placement, IQAC, PRO, Deans, International affairs, Admission, CHRO and Pro-VC.



- The examination section was redesigned and expanded. A new COE, Deputy COE, Office staff collection, storage chambers were constructed.
- A new state of art laboratory in collaboration with the company Eurofins was constructed at the University the equipment in the Eurofins lab are high end research based equipment.
- Central instrumentation facility has been developed for supporting Phd level research. This facility has many instruments.
- The existing studios were renovated and upgraded.

# FINANCIAL

- From the year 2019-2022 the University has received Rs. 1,47,76,362 under UGC,CSIR, VGST and DST grants. A total of Rs. 32,99,736 have been awarded for 24 seed money projects.
- For the year 2022-2023 the university has spent Rs. 9,73,78,950 for salaries, PF, staff insurance and staff welfare expenses. The University has spent Rs. 83,92,017 under academic expenses in the year 2022-2023. The University has spent Rs. 73,16,093 for students activities in the year 2022-2023.
- To upgrade the Library facility with books, journals, subscription and software Rs. 33,67,482 was spent in the year 2022-2023.
- To upgrade and develop lab facilities the University has spent Rs. 1,38,40,736 in the year 2022-2023.

## RANKING:

- NIRF: In the NIRF Ranking for the year 2023 we were placed at the Band Rank 100-150. This ranking was in the name of the St. Joseph's college, Autonomous.
- INDIA TODAY RANKING: In the India today ranking at the BCA category our college secured 2nd in India and 2nd in the city. In the BA Arts section secured 18th Rank in India and 2nd in the city. In the BSc Science category our college secured 12th Rank in India and 1st in the city. In the BCom category our college secured 42nd Rank in India and 6th in the city. We are placed as the top 5 emerging colleges for BCom in the country. In the Mass Communication Category our college secured 18th Rank in India and 3rd in the city In the Social Work Category our college secured 18th Rank in India and 3rd in the city
- THE WEEK RANKING: In "THE WEEK MAGAZINE RANKING" for the year 2023, for the Science category we secured 17th Rank in India. In the Arts category we secured 18th Rank in India. In the Commerce category we secured 28th Rank in India. In the Mass Communication category we stood at 17th Rank in India. ## RESEARCH CENTER: SJRIC

- There are 33 recognised guides at the university.

## PLACEMENT:

• The placement data for the year 2022-2023

Number of final year students placed students placed : UG - 551 out of 1584. Number of final year students placed students placed : PG - 351 out of 580. Other students have opted for higher education.

- The Centre for Skill Development and Placement began the process of placements with companies like EY, Finastra, Aditya Birla, Firstsource, Delta, Deloitte, Axa, Ather, NatWest, Mu Sigma and Arvind Fashions. Campus Drives were conducted by all these companies for students from different streams. The sessions included interview rounds with pre-placement presentations, online screening, and shortlisted students invited for online/ offline interviews.
- Ionage Technologies Pvt Ltd Sales conducted a campus drive for immediate Joiners with a stipend of INR 15,000 per month and an internship Duration of 4 months. The following positions were targeted- Customer Success, Marketing and Sustainability, open to students from any department who were passionate about building a career in Sales.



- Fully functional sewage treatment plant is set up at the university.
- Biogas plant supplying the source energy to hostel kitchen
- 425 KWH of power is generated by solar energy alone during peak hours and the university is contributing in fighting global warming by reducing emission of 7600 kg co2 every month and annually 91,000kg
- Fully functional green-house to maintain plants
- The campus has a completed rain water harvesting system.
- Playground with bermuda tiff grass (for water retention) and underwater drainage system with connections to rain water harvesting unit.
- Vermicomposting pit generates manure and earthworms are reared in it.
- Plastic-free campus: an initiative to outlaw the use of plastic products on campus is taken up by the administration.
- Every year world earth day climate change rally by the ministry of youth and sports affairs, government of karnataka.
- Lake cleaning drive and plant distribution is conducted every year.
- Online plantation drive: the outreach team planned an online plantation drive for the kids in honor of republic day. more than 200 kids took part in the online planting campaign, where they were required to create a video with a message and plant a sapling on their property.
- Pot painting was conducted on September 8, 2022 at the green house, PG campus, St Joseph's University.
- OUTREACH: Bembala is the outreach division of SJU students are taught the importance of community service and how we can help those who are less privileged. Some of the major projects taken by Bembala during the year 2022-23 include vigilance awareness week; children's day celebrations; rural exposure camps to Sindagi and Manvi; paper bag making and distribution to local shops; traffic awareness drive, and many more. Bembala has received awards for the following anti-drug campaign from the excise department, government of karnataka, and world earth day climate change rally by the ministry of youth and sports affairs, Government of Karnataka.
- BEST OUT OF WASTE: Best out of waste was held on november 10, 2022, from 1 pm to 3 pm under the leadership of amrutha m. It is a craft which follows environmental-friendly principles and creates useful objects out of waste products. participants were given an hour to create anything that was the best out of waste, after which the final objects were displayed. participants used their imagination and creativity to make innovative objects using bangles, plastic bottles, cds, and so on. Things which are seen as waste in our day-to-day lives were used in a constructive manner and a variety of items were made from them.
- CLEANLINESS DRIVE: The cleanliness drive was conducted on november 11, 2022, to create an opportunity for volunteers to assist in the daily running of the college premises. About 30 volunteers from all units took part in the event, who were then divided into groups. Volunteers cleared the store room, college basement, where groups were assigned to arrange files in the admin office and arrange tables, chairs, and other office furniture. They also assisted in the segregation of useful items and scrap materials. Volunteers were



provided refreshments and lunch. They were able to spend a day in the shoes of the hardworking non-teaching staff and understand their duties.

- CLEANLINESS DRIVE: On february 01, 2023, nss unit-2 held a cleanliness drive to create awareness on cleanliness. Volunteers were given manual items and taken out of the campus. They were split into two major groups and taken to a nearby post office and a park respectively. The post office was cleaned, swept, and wiped; racks were cleaned and messed up things were arranged in their places. volunteers even built a wall using the stones which were looking bad. Another group was taken to a park and made to clean in and out of the park. They also picked up dry leaves, plastic (bag, paper, bottle) to maintain the appearance and hygiene of the park, protect the environment and wildlife that live there, and provide an attractive environment for visitors. DISASTER MANAGEMENT: On february 20, 2023, nss unit-2 organised a disaster management campaign in collaboration with unit-1. The event aimed to promote safety and health in the community by preparing for, responding to, and recovering from natural or man-made disasters. TALK: On May 8, 2022, talks regarding the importance of water conservation and sustainable water management were delivered by experts in the field of water management, environmental science, and sustainability. The event provided a platform for experts, students, and the learned water entries general public to exchange ideas and experiences on water management. It also highlighted the role of individuals and communities in ensuring water security and promoted the need for a comprehensive approach to water management.
- NEERATHON: On May 8, 2022, a one-day event, neerathon 2022, was held at st joseph's university to raise awareness about water conservation and promote sustainable water management practices. The event was organised by the university's wildlife awareness and conservation club and the public relations office. It was open to students, faculty, and the general public.
