

Report on Anti-Ragging Day Event at St. Joseph's University

The Anti-Ragging Committee at St. Joseph's University successfully organized Anti-Ragging Day on August 12, 2024, kicking off Anti-Ragging Week, which ran from August 12 to August 18, 2024. The event aimed to create awareness among students about the harmful effects of ragging and to promote a safe, inclusive campus environment.

On August 12, the following events took place:

Poster Display: Creative and informative posters were displayed across the campus, emphasizing the importance of preventing ragging and promoting mutual respect among students. These posters served as visual reminders of the university's zero-tolerance policy on ragging.

Human Chain: Students and faculty members formed a human chain on campus to symbolically demonstrate unity against ragging. This act of solidarity aimed to send a strong message that ragging would not be tolerated at St. Joseph's University.
