

Workshop by Ms. Maria Lopez de Bayas

The workshop on "Impactful CV Preparation & Mobility Funds for Researchers," conducted by Ms. Maria Lopez de Bayas, took place on Tuesday, 25th February 2025, from 2:45 PM to 4:15 PM at the Staff Seminar Room near the Banyan Tree. The session commenced with a warm welcome and opening remarks by **Fr. Dr. Roshan Castelino SJ, the Research Director** at SJRI. In his address, he emphasized the significance of continuous learning and development for research scholars, setting a strong foundation for the insightful discussions that followed.

Her insights encouraged participants to adopt a strategic approach in presenting their strengths, ensuring their CVs reflect their expertise and potential effectively.

The second part of the session focused on **mobility funds and financial support** available for Ph.D. students, particularly those conducting research in humanities and languages. Ms. Maria elaborated on the various funding opportunities, detailing the application processes, eligibility criteria, and the diverse range of countries offering financial support to research scholars. She placed special emphasis on the numerous opportunities available for Indian students seeking to collaborate with institutions in non-English speaking European countries. These mobility funds aim to facilitate international exposure for researchers, enabling them to expand their academic horizons and establish valuable global connections.

The workshop proved to be highly informative and empowering for the attendees, equipping them with essential tools and knowledge to advance their academic careers. The insights shared by Ms. Maria will undoubtedly play a crucial role in guiding scholars through the complexities of academic job markets and funding applications.
