Resolution: It is resolved to establish a clear framework for awarding academic credits to students based on their participation in Youth Red Cross (YRC) activities. Here's a breakdown of the resolution:

2 credits will be awarded for active participation in YRC events and initiatives, provided the student has completed 60 hours of engagement.

An additional 1 credit can be earned by completing an extra 60 hours of participation, making it a total of 3 credits for 120 hours of engagement.

2 credits will be awarded for attending State or National YRC camps. The YRC Nodal Officer is responsible for approving all these credits, ensuring that students meet the required criteria and maintaining the integrity of the credit-awarding process.

Resolution:

It is resolved to offer one credit to the exhibitors who demonstrate their learning, skills, and experience during the annual event ELIXIR.

Resolution: It is proposed that students who demonstrate exceptional achievements in sports, NSS, and NCC be awarded 5 extra marks in each course during a given semester, subject to the following conditions: -

Sports: Students who represent St Joseph University in various sports events in the Inter-University South zone tournament / All India Inter-University and qualify to play quarter finals, who represent the

State or Country with the prior permission from the Department of Physical Education, St Joseph's University in national or international level sports events.

NCC: Students who attend the following centrally or state-level camps:

 - Advance Leadership Camp
 - Mountaineering Camp
 - National Integration Camp
 - Army Attachment Camp
 - Cycle/Motorcycle expeditions

NSS: Students who participate in state-level or national-level Republic Day parade or Youth exchange programme (international), Mountaineering or Trekking expedition organised by the Government of India.

Preamble: St Joseph's University has partnered with a few foreign universities through Memoranda of Understanding (MoU), enabling students to participate in a year-long or a few weeks or months exchange program. Due to differences in curriculum structures between St Joseph's University and the host universities, a process is needed to equate credits and courses. This resolution aims to establish

a procedure for approving credit and course equivalencies for students participating in the exchange program and also to ensure that students participating in the exchange program can transfer credits and courses from the host university back to St Joseph's University, while also completing any required university-specific courses and examinations.

The following resolution is placed before the Board of Studies for approval as the whole resolution or with amendments therein without disturbing the requirements.

Resolution: It is resolved that the Head of the department or programme coordinator is authorized to approve credits and courses offered by the host university, in lieu of St Joseph's University's credits and courses, for students selected for the exchange program. This approval must be obtained before the student leaves for the host university. The approval must be ratified by the Dean of the respective School. The Controller of Examination will advise students to complete any university-specific courses, if applicable, in the given semester in the next available chance.
