The need for understanding and empathy and diffusing anger before responding to children was explained in detail. Students were taken to many general compulsion procedures in printing. One such was screen making; big machines were accommodated in a ten-by-ten room meant for screen developing. On the other side of the room, the cover pages of the book were being laminated in machines, according to required thickness and orders prescribed. Students were happy and excited to learn about printing technology. They spent time interacting with employees and learned more about the procedures modern printing technology.

Students of the Stem Cell and Next Generation Therapeutics attended a one day Animal Cell Culture workshop conducted by Icrest International Stemcell Services Ltd. The first batch of students attended the workshop on September 3, 2022 and the second batch on September 10, 2022. iCREST academy provides an educational setting designed to introduce highly motivated students to conceptual learning in the life sciences and biological sciences. This method involves a special blending of classroom instruction with hands-on exploration which strengthens and gives the learning process a new depth.



In the workshop, students were introduced to fundamental principles and techniques of animal cell culture. The techniques provide a good foundation and are essential in every

cell culture lab. The workshop included hands-on training in cell culture revival. trypsinisation. passaging. cell counting and cryopreservation, and a hands on demonstration on cell culture media preparation and filtration. These techniques were practised on HeLa cells and mononucleated cells (MNCs). The workshop also focused on understanding the principles and methodology of these techniques. The aim of the workshop was to create a gateway to animal cell culture, develop skills, and create interest among the participants.

II year MSc Biotechnology students were taken on an Industrial visit to Research and Development wing of Thermo Fisher Scientific in Whitefield on November 24, 2022. The Who is Hussain organization launched its ambitious #GlobalBloodHeroes campaign. aiming to break the world record for the most blood donations in one day. Coinciding with World Blood Donation Day, the campaign, coordinated by all units of NSS, invited the public worldwide to register to donate blood. More than 50 Camps were set up in India for this purpose. One among them was St. Joseph's University and with the collaboration of NCC and NSS, around 700 units of blood were collected through this camp. The Blood Banks that were present to collect the blood were: Indira Gandhi Blood Bank, Narayana Health Blood Bank, and Bangalore Medical Services Trust Blood Bank. The basketball court of the University was specifically allocated for the students and the staff to donate, whereas in Xavier Hall other people outside the university donated blood. Mr Syed Kirmani, former Indian cricketer, Dr (Fr) Victor Lobo SJ, Vice Chancellor, St Joseph's University, and

many other eminent personalities were also present to grace the occasion and to bring awareness about donating blood. News 1 Kannada, Tv 9, and other news channels were also present to cover the event. The Blood donation started at 8:00 am and went up to 6:00 pm. The Campaign broke the world record for the largest blood drive in history. Authenticated by the Official World Records, the total number of blood donations was 37.018, beating the previous record of 34,723 set in 2020. With up to three lives saved per donation, over 110,000 lives could be saved by the campaign's effort.

## International Basketball Tournament

The FIBA U-18 Women's Asian Basketball Championships was held in two divisions. While the eight teams in Division A' played their matches at the Sree Kanteerava stadium, and Division 'B', comprising a similar number of teams, witnessed the action at the Koramangala indoor stadium. Hosts India was in Division A with China, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Chinese Taipei, Australia, and New Zealand. Division B consisted of Hong Kong, Jordan, Malaysia, Maldives, Mongolia, Philippines, Samoa, and Thailand. The top four teams from the seven-day meet qualified for the FIBA U-19 Women's World Cup to be held in Madrid from July 15-23 next year.



Preparations were on track and both venues were refurbished as per FIBA guidelines. The Department of Youth Empowerment & Sports provided full assistance to the Basketball Federation of India. In total, 192 players, 96 officials, and 100 volunteers participated in the championship. The volunteers of the National Service Scheme of St. Joseph's University were invited as an audience to cheer for all the teams. Coordinated by all units of NSS. The volunteers had the opportunity to learn about the sport and were able to witness the other countries' talent as well. They also organized themselves in assisting the international participants who had attended the event.

### Walkathon

On October 16, 2022, a Walkathon was organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan in collaboration with the Ministry of youth affairs and sports to celebrate World Standards day from Bangalore palace to Vidhana Soudha. Drinking water is water intended for human consumption from any source, treated or untreated. The quality standards for drinking water in India are prescribed by the Bureau of Indian Standards laid down ISI 10500: 2012. The ISI mark certifies that a product conforms to an Indian standard developed by the BIS. Coordinated by all units of NSS, the volunteers reached Bangalore Palace and were asked to sign the volunteer list and fill in their contact number along with



their signature. The volunteers were given a water bottle with an ISI mark on it. The event organizers briefed the volunteers about the event. They also created awareness about the fake ISI symbols on utensils. The event began around 10:00 am. The end venue Vidhana Soudha was cancelled since the minister's consent was not sought. Given that the event was a walkathon, the fact that volunteers were obstructing traffic was upsetting the general public. The volunteers were instructed to return by walking to the Bangalore Palace. After the ceremony, breakfast was served to the volunteers. The walkathon conducted by the organization provided the volunteers with an insight into the duplicates of the brand and it has led to a motivational reason for having adapted to healthy lifestyle change

### **Inaugural ceremony**

On October 19, 2022, the NSS cell of St. Joseph's University organised the inauguration ceremony of the National Service Scheme. At 3:00 pm, Unit-2 Programme Officer Ms Raj Kiran gave a welcome address to commence the programme. Dr Ronald Mascarenhas. Pro Vice Chancellor of St. Joseph's University, Shri Pratap Lingaiah, state officer for the NSS in Karnataka, and Sri. YM Uppin, youth officer for the Government of Karnataka all attended the ceremony as honorary main guests. They were cordially welcomed by Mr Selwyn Paul J, NSS program Coordinator of St. Joseph's University. Followed by the lighting of lamps and untying the banner of NSS. The first speaker, Shri Prathap Lingaiah, began by emphasising the value of service in a student's life. This event marked the significant start of NSS cell in St. Joseph's University. The insightful words from all the honorable guests of the day indeed made the evening worth it and productive.

### Koti Kanta Gayana

occasion On the of Kannada Rajyotsava, Karnataka the government organised a program 'Koti Kanta Gayana' on October 28, 2022, at 11:00 am. The aim was to involve one crore of volunteers in this program and create a world record. Coordinated by all units of NSS, this was organized for the volunteers to be aware of the importance of the language and know its significance. The program comprised volunteers singing Kannada songs that were about Karnataka and Kannada. All 50 volunteers left the University around 10:22 am and reached Kanteerava Stadium by 10:40 a.m. A few volunteers were given Karnataka flags and all the people in the stadium were given cookies and veg puffs. Six Kannada songs were sung simultaneously by thousands of voices. The songs were as follows: State Anthem, Udayavagali Namma Cheluva Kannada Nadu, Barisu Kannada Dindimava, Hacchevu Kannada Deepa, Vishwavinutana Vidyachetana, and Huttidi Kannadali Nadalli Utdi Udali Nadu. Later, there was a photo session of all the volunteers from the NSS units of St. Joseph's University along with the NSS coordinator. The event generated a sense of pride in the minds of the volunteers for being a part of a culture that is so rich and vibrant.



### **NSS Festival**

Celebration of the 15th year of meritorious service of the Credit-I organisation was held on October 29, 2022, as part of the NSS Festival. Various literary and cultural statelevel inter-university competitions were organised. 11 volunteers from our university participated in this event that included all units. The volunteers were accompanied by Mr Prasad and they departed Bengaluru at 5:00 am and reached Mysore at 8:25 a.m. Later on, the team reached Kala Mandira where instructions about the events were given. After the session, the volunteers from all the universities headed to the respective venues where the competitions were conducted simultaneously. After the competitions, lunch was provided to all the volunteers. There was a monoact drama performed by Mysore University, continued by a valedictory programme, where the winners of the Janapada competitions were announced along with achievers from rural backgrounds were awarded the "Karnataka Kanmani" award. Ms Bhumika, from our university, won third prize in the Janapada singing competition and won a cash prize of



Rs.2000. The program ended at 7:00 p.m. and the team departed from Mysore at 8:00 p.m. Through this event, the volunteers were able to gain new skills, understand the social history of the NSS festival, discover ideas on culture, and be open.

### **Inauguration Ceremony**

On October 31, 2022, the ceremony was planned as the NSS unit -1 & 2 inauguration and badging ceremony for the recently elected committee members. The activity took place offline in Xavier Hall, PG Block. Ms Santa Sylvia, creator of Hope Nest, and Mr Selwyn Paul, NSS Program Coordinator, were the event's main guests. Even though it was the first time, over 200 volunteers took part in the event, which received a surprising amount of support.

### National Unity Day

On the special Occasion of National Unity Day, The National Service Scheme Unit-1 and Unit -2 organised a programme called "National Unity Day" on October 31, 2022, at 12:00 pm. The aim was to bring awareness of unity among people. Mrs Santa Sylvia, founder of NGO "Hope nest" was the chief guest at the event. After a brief introduction about herself, she began by talking about social services and their effects. She talked about her life experiences of being a social work degree holder despite being bad at studies and how those experiences shaped her into who she is today. Later on, she spoke on the discrimination she faced due to her dark skin which led to a Campaign to promote equality based on skin colour, and how this helped her to gradually form the NGO, "Hope Nest". The reason behind the celebration was to make people aware of the ideas of staying together and uplifting society. The event helped volunteers understand why it is important to instill a service mentality in them. This was a great opportunity to deepen these bonds by bringing people together who see each other rarely.

### **Talent Hunt (Volunteers)**

The purpose of the event Volunteers Got Talent was to showcase the top skills among our volunteers. Six or more of the cultural events held on campus were offline. Every event went off without a hitch. Dancing, singing, stand-up comedy, and other activities are included in the events. The volunteers eagerly participated and displayed their abilities.

### **Tale of Two Elephants**

To take part in the programme, the volunteers had travelled to A Rocha India First Field Study. Giving an introduction to the organisation and its programmes was the main goal. Several huge creatures that are in danger of extinction rely on the forests of southern India, yet these areas contain dense human populations. Around 256 square kilometers are protected by Bannerghatta National Park (BNP), which is located in the Eastern Ghats and is only 22 kilometers south of Bangalore, India's third-largest metropolis. It is a crucial landscape because it links to bigger forest tracts in the South, offering an undisturbed connection between the Eastern and Western Ghats. It is a part of the biggest scrub forests in the nation.

### **National Constitution Day**

Mr Vasanth, Advocate (High Court of Karnataka) was the guest speaker. The seminar was hugely informative and provided the participants, academicians, and the teaching faculty, with enormous knowledge on various aspects of the Indian Constitution and the fundamental rights of its citizens. Mr Thakur said that nurturing secularism helps to get rid of intolerance and Linguistic

pluralism has to be nurtured. He ends this address by saying that it is the people of a country who make the constitution work. Later on, he elaborated on Amendments to the Indian constitution and the various challenges to modern India, Constitutional trends: Secularism is the basic structure of the Indian constitution, and Fundamental rights and modern-day challenges. He concluded his session by stating how Fundamental rights aim to restore the individual and collective interest, but however, there are also challenges such as lack of information on Fundamental Rights, adjustments that make us comply with the wrong, no critical thinking and evaluation of choosing our representatives. decriminalisation on the basis of religion, privatization in the government and citizens not casting their votes and even using NOTA.

### **National Constitution Day (Quiz)**

The NSS council members organised a guiz online for volunteers to participate as part of the celebration of Indian Constitution Day. The programme began as soon as all of the volunteers entered the meeting. As soon as the meeting began, the council members addressed volunteers before giving participants instructions about the quiz. The quiz was sent through Google forms. The participants were seen taking the quiz seriously. Once the given time was up, google forms closed on its own. Overall, the quiz was an enriching experience for the council members and volunteers.

### **Human Rights Day**

On the account of Human Rights Day, an event was organised on December 10, 2022, at Indian Social Institute, Benson Town. After the arrival of the volunteers at the venue around 3:30 pm, the organizers welcomed them with snacks and drinks. The chief guest addressed the gathering and spoke about Human Rights and their significance. Several students performed dancing, singing, and skits as part of the event. The purpose of the occasion was to announce and award prizes to college students who participated in different NSS

committee-organized events. It was a 3-hour show that lasted until late evening. When the programme drew to an end, they distributed candles and requested each volunteer to light one and say a prayer before the session was wrapped off with a group photo.

### Quizeton

"Quizeton" was held on November 5, 2022, from 1:00 pm to 2:00 pm. The quiz was conducted to put out the message that "the measure of intelligence is the ability to change." The quiz was conducted for the students to showcase their skills and knowledge. Under the guidance of Mr Vinay M, the representative of Unit-2, the event was conducted in an online webinar. The speaker for the program was Ms Veena Nirmala, from the Department of Mathematics. Ms Veena offered a brief explanation



of the creation and operation of the NSS as well as the state of Karnataka. She insisted that the volunteers must act responsibly and with discipline in order to portray themselves as effective NSS volunteers. The webinar, meanwhile, was bilingual, containing elements of both English Kannada, making it first challenging to grasp. With time, though, it became simpler thanks to the accompanying slideshow. The quiz was held towards the end of the event and was based on the webinar. It consisted of 30 questions, among which 10 questions were about Karnataka and remaining 20 questions were about NSS and its history. This event was conducted for the volunteers to gain knowledge about NSS and Karnataka.

### Walkathon

In collaboration with the election commission of India, a walkathon was organized to spread awareness about voting on November 9, 2022. Volunteers from St. Joseph's University were also called to participate in this event. The walkathon began at 6:30 am, starting at the designated locations of Hudson Circle and Lalbagh Gate and ending at Bala Bhavana. Every volunteer who took part in the walkathon received a cap carrying the emblem of the Karnataka government. After arriving at the venue, they were briefed about the importance of voting and how it is a fundamental right of every citizen. He further added that many do not know how to apply for a voter ID. So, in order to teach the general public the importance of it, a walkathon was organized. The volunteers were enthusiastic and enjoyed participating in the walkathon by holding placards and posters. Refreshments were also provided to the volunteers who participated. Through this, they were able to learn the importance of voting and how it is the duty of every citizen to choose the right representative for the country.

### Best out of waste

The event Best Out of Waste was held on November 10, 2022, at 1:00 pm at St. Joseph University. The event's goal was to promote environmentally friendly practices while simultaneously making usable items out of discarded materials. After arriving at the venue, the volunteers were briefed about the rules and regulations of the event. Participants were given a time of 1-hour to create something out of the waste materials. Participants used their imagination and creativity to make innovative things. All the waste materials from daily life were put to constructive use, and a variety of items were created from them. Ms Raj Kiran who was the staff in charge of the event also looked at the creative preparation done by the participants. After an hour, the participants were told to display the innovative things which were done out of waste. Mr Ebenezer from the Statistics department was the judge for the event. The participants



were judged based on creativity, design, and presentation. The event concluded around 3:00 pm. Through this, the participants were able to showcase their creative talent.

### Cleanliness drive

The university management needed volunteers to clean the store room which is located in the basement. Volunteers who were interested registered their name. The cleanliness drive was held on November 11, 2022. The volunteers had to assemble before the NSS office by 8:45 am. They were all led to the parking basement once they arrived to assist the college staff and cleaning crew in sorting stuff into two categories: (1) scrap and (2) goods that may be utilised again. The volunteers were provided with masks and two gloves each. They were divided into two teams. Five volunteers made up each team, and they were instructed to assist the cleaning crew by sorting all of the folders and files. Tables, chairs, cabinets, and other heavy objects had to be moved by the remaining volunteers. The volunteers had organised everything as scrap and reuse in a basement interior area that had been cleaned. Afterwards, the cleaning crew needed the volunteers' assistance to clean a room close to the Science building where all the medical supplies were kept during the covid periods. The initiative for a cleanliness drive ended at that point. The volunteers were able to understand the struggles college cleaning workers face every day.

### Create and reflect

The event was conducted on November 15, 2022, at 12:00 pm in the auditorium basement of St. Joseph's University. The event's theme is "create and reflect," therefore participants must both develop and execute a skit or play based on the topics provided, as well as immediately create a poster based on that topic. The group members were divided on spot and were told to select a representative among themselves and were given a topic as well. They were 7 groups, each consisting of 5 to 6 members. The groups were provided a time limit of 10 mins to discuss the topic and their plans to execute it. Ms Raj Kiran was asked to attend the event as a guest and spectator. She then came to the ceremony, saw all the posters, and expressed her appreciation. Following that, the groups were called to perform the skit, and they did a fantastic job by coming up with a story and executing the topic very well. The event came to an end around 3:00 pm. ### Walkathon

The Indian Red Cross Society, the Department of Youth Empowerment and Sports, and other like-minded organisations worked together to organise an event under the National Service Scheme. # NSS UNIT-4 Orientation and Investiture Ceremony

The volunteers cooperated well with the guests and were active and involved in the session. The chief quests were given greeting cards as a small token of appreciation.

The Intra-College event was organized by the Council for Molecular and Computational Biology of St. Joseph's University. The National Service Scheme Unit 4 was approached to arrange 20 volunteers for the Discipline Maintenance of the event. They were assigned to the morning shift which was from 8:00 am to 11:30 am. All the volunteers assembled in front of the Auditorium at 8:00 am as instructed by the Disciplinary In charge of the event, Mr Ajith. The Volunteers were briefed about their roles. The participants from other colleges started arriving and the volunteers were positioned from the registration table to the auditorium for guiding the participants. The volunteers were also posted inside the Auditorium where the inauguration of the event took place. The inauguration started at 8:30 am. Later, all the volunteers

reached the auditorium basement at 10:30 am as instructed for the Trials of Treasure Hunt. All the volunteers were given refreshments as well. The Disciplinary In Charge Mr Ajith delivered the volunteering certificates of all the volunteers after two days of the event, on November 4, 2022, and they were given to all the volunteers across the unit. The volunteers gained an understanding of volunteering for competitions and were able to learn the maintenance of discipline among a large crowd. They also learned how to cooperate with each other.

### **Poster-Making Competition**

The National Service Scheme (UNIT 4) of St Joseph's University organized poster-making competition on November 4, 2022. The intent of the poster-making event is to make volunteers think differently about the things that they may be learning or doing. There are a variety of ways to communicate with society, but one of the most beneficial ways is by interacting with the people around by using posters that can clearly display the message. When used correctly, posters can catch the eves of people and make them aware of certain issues existing within society that they wouldn't otherwise have known about. The theme for the poster-making competition was NSS and social issues involved in society. This event helped students connect with other volunteers and worked together as a team. The judges for the event were Mr. Prasad, Assistant programme



officer unit 4, and NSS coordinator Mr Selwyn Paul J. In total, 25 volunteers participated in the event in which 11 teams were made; solo and groups. The volunteers were enthusiastic and came up with different themes that were beautifully portrayed in the posters. The event went on for an hour and photos were clicked with the volunteers along with their posters. The judges showed a lot of interest and supported the volunteers. The posters were judged on the basis of creativity and theme relevance. The judges decided on the winners right after the event.

### Walkathon

The Election Commission of India with the collaboration of BBMP and other organizations organized a walkathon on November 9, 2022, to bring awareness about the importance of voting. The event started off with the organizers briefing about the importance of voting. Volunteers were asked to actively get involved in the walkathon to bring awareness about voting. The walkathon was from 6:30 am onwards, from the allotted start destination: Hudson circle, Lalbagh gate to the end destination: Bala Bhavana. Caps with the Karnataka government logo were provided to every volunteer who participated in the walkathon. Students from various colleges and schools also participated in the walkathon. This event enabled the volunteers to be courageous and confident in showcasing their talents/ potential. For this event, volunteers were present as both audiences and participants. # Road Accident Prevention Programme

State National Service Scheme Cell, in collaboration with the Department of youth empowerment and sports, Indian Red Cross Society and other organizations celebrated Road Accident Prevention Day on November 17, 2022. On this day, a Walkathon was held from 7:00 am to 9:00 am, with the start location being Kanteerava Stadium and the destination being Vidhana Soudha. After the volunteers had arrived, placards were held with road safety messages. A small talk on the importance of safety rules and a brief explanation on how to drive safely was given by the organizers to the volunteers. Right after the speech, the volunteers were asked to begin with the walkathon program and by 8:30 am, the program came to an end. Sounds of thundering claps and silly 'woos' echoed around the St. Joseph's campus and the lively conversation of film, caste, revolution, and pent-up feelings of boys came to an end with a cup of tea for everyone.

### Social Justice Film Festival

The Social Justice Film Festival commenced on January 30, 2022, and was curated with socially relevant messages that were embedded in the films curated by director R. P. Amudhan. Amudhan, who has curated fifteen such festivals, believes the essence of film watching lies in the community it creates and extends when you engage in it with other people. This edition of the Social Justice Film Festival, comprised eleven different films that were screened for two consecutive days, dealing with topics ranging from the treatment of migrant workers and refugees to the experiences of the d/ deaf and disabled community. The film screening saw the works of directors like Basav Biradar, Priya Thuvassery, Bani Singh, Akshat Sharma, Mohd.

Fehmeed and Zeeshan Amir Khan also included which interactive sessions post screening with the directors and the audience. In one of the movies, Native Place, filmmaker Andrew Francisco travels to various Indian cities to record the lives of migrant labourers who reside and work there. This sensation of longing is so brilliantly captured in a spectacular montage in the movie where several workers discuss their intentions to return home, to their respective native places. Another film, Ripples Under the Skin blends together mythology, history and the stories of people today to portray the lives of bishti workers. It uses water imagery and sounds to create an almost otherworldly effect during some parts. Shreya Ghosh and her team in We Make Film, go on a journey of exploration and collaboration, talking to filmmakers who belong to the d/deaf and disabled communities. Ghosh especially discovers a new way to relate to and understand her father, who himself belongs to the disabled community.

One such film, White Slam, which was shown at the SJFF, takes us to North Madras, the birthplace of numerous carrom champions, and shows us the tale of their hometown and aspirations for sporting success as they navigate daily difficulties and difficulties. Footloose, one of the later movies that concluded the film festival, demonstrates the disparate treatment given to refugees who belong to various faith sects. On one side, Rohingya Muslim camps are attacked and set on fire, while Hindu refugees from Pakistan celebrate and name their newborn children after their newly acquired citizenship. Through strong side-by-side comparisons and storytelling, it demonstrates first-hand the absurdities of the Citizenship Amendment Act.

A memorial for the late filmmaker K P Sasi marked the festival's conclusion. The film on him by R P Amudhan was brilliant in its simplicity and execution. The extended discussion was almost like having Sasi in the hallway with us, and the flute melody he plays at the conclusion is sure to stay with the audience for a very long time, reminding everyone of home.

### **Nose Cut**

At exactly 1:00pm, classroom A314 in the Arrupe Block was packed in the peak hours of lunch, as students awaited the beginning of Nose Cut. An event that's like an amazing marriage of a press conference, imitation and trolling and the closest one can ever get to celebrities up front, Nose Cut is one of the if not the best known event, hosted by NOUS.

Kim Kardashian, Mohan Bhagwat and the likes of Yograj Bhat were in attendance during this hour where Kim Kardashian announced, "My body, my choice" when asked about ocean and plastic pollution. Naina, impersonating the infamous Kim Kardashian, said "I kicked him (Kanye) out for a reason", in an accent so authentic it brought out roars of laughter. If you don't have children, who will take land?" Mohan Bhagwat gets off stage with triumphant slogans of RSS and everyone applauds with confusion and amusement somehow reflecting the very picture painted in the larger canvas.

A not so cool Yash, impersonates Captain Cool, M S Dhoni as everyone cheers him on. After many short and puzzling answers, Dhoni finally hits everyone with, "We won against RCB", when questioned about the disappointing performance of CSK, therefore successfully dodging the

question but failing to keep his cool. He gets off the podium after garnering a mix of agreement and sneers from sad RCB fans.

While time runs at an even faster speed, music swells in from the corner of the class, and a very meditative Tom walks to the podium as he holds his phone up so everyone can hear his entry music. Swami Nithyananda, impersonated by Tom, sits on the table as everyone welcomes him with laughter and applause. He denies any association with RSS, as Mohan Bhagwat accused him of getting paid by them. 




